



JANUARY 5, 2012 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met January 5, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of December 19, 2011. Corman, Brown and Combs present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and was posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Brown announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Brown approved the agenda and the December 19, 2011 minutes The reason for the meeting in the Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners Meeting Room is to conduct the Reorganization Meeting for 2012. Chairman Brown handed over the meeting to Clerk Kassebaum.

Clerk Kassebaum updated the Board on some miscellaneous items with some discussion. The County Clerk, District Court and the County Court submitted the December 2011 County Board Reports however the Board did not act on them and will readdress them on the January 9, 2012 meeting.

First order of Business was to appoint a 2012 Chairman for County Board of Commissioners. Clerk Kassebaum asked for nominations. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to appoint Michael D. Combs as the Chairman of the County Board of Commissioners for the calendar year 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. Clerk Kassebaum handed the meeting over to Commissioner Michael D. Combs.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve Resolution #1-12R Appointing Danny K. Corman as Acting Chairman in the absence of Chairman Combs. Combs, Corman & Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Nuckolls County, Nebraska that **Danny K. Corman** be, and hereby is, elected and appointed Acting Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners Nuckolls County, Nebraska, for the purpose of enabling said **Danny K. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT his acts and doings as such acting Chairman shall have full force and effect as though done by the regularly elected Chairman of the Board of Commissioners; that he is specifically empowered to sign all warrants or other legal instruments written from and including January 6,





2011, and the said appointment be also made for the purpose of enabling **Danny K. Corman** to act as Chairman whenever **Michael D. Combs** is absent or disabled or for any reason is unable to perform the duties of Chairman; that the word Acting need not be inserted on the warrants or other legal instruments in front of the phrase "Chairman County Commissioners" in order for the warrants or other legal instruments to have full force and effect.

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING DEPOSITORY BANKS AND AUTHORIZING COUNTY TREASURER TO INVEST COUNTY FUNDS

WHEREAS, the following banks have been depositories for funds of the County of Nuckolls for the year 2012, and have made application to remain and continue as depositories for county funds for the year 2012, and have pledged securities in the amounts hereinafter indicated to guarantee the repayment of County Funds deposited in said banks; and,

WHEREAS, the said banks are considered by the Board of County Commissioners to be qualified depositories for the funds of the County;

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the January 30, 2012 minutes as submitted. The following correspondence was submitted to the Board in advance of the meeting: The CASA Advocate Newsletter for February 2012.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to accept the County Clerk, District Court and County Treasurer's January 2012 Board Reports as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Clerk Kassebaum remitted the January 2012 Aggregate Stop/Loss Report from Mid-American Benefits, Inc. for the 2011/2012 Employee Insurance. Currently we are at 52.1% Loss ratio. Kassebaum requested to purchase a basic black/white inkjet printer for the public access computer. The printer will only print documents from the Register of Deeds program. The Board gave their approval.

Susan Rogers, County Assessor met with the Board to announce employee Lisa Kovanda has passed the examination required to be a County Assessor and/or Deputy. Kovanda has been promoted to Deputy County Assessor. Rogers also announced that she has hired Elizabeth Sauce as a part-time employee who will work 2 days a week or more when needed. Rogers discussed the Ag land values for 2012/2013.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to discuss the current activities of the County Road Department. Also present is Mark Mainelli, of Mainelli Wagner Assoc. Warren noted they did snow removal on Sunday and will continue with snow removal this week. Warren announced they would be working 7:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. until the snow has been cleaned up. After the snow removal is complete they will be doing repairs and maintenance on the motorgraders and etc. in the Nelson shop. Warren gave Combs an update on the current status with concerns with the BN Rail Road. It was noted they R.R. will be putting in new rail sometime but no date was given. Warren reported he will have some of the road employees working this week on the ceiling in the County Judges office at the Courthouse. Warren





reported on the amount of dollars Nuckolls County will be receiving in LPA Funds. This is for the Approximate Federal Fund Purchase Distribution based on current funding levels and 80% exchange rate for STP Funds \$47,287.20 and HBP Funds \$67,315.87 for a total amount of \$114,603.07. It was noted the HBP Funds amount changed from \$89,754.00 in May 2011. That is \$22,397.00 less. Warren also noted they are working on the sign inventory.

Mark Mainelli gave the Board an update on some current Legislative Bills that will affect the County Road Departments. Mainelli discussed LB 827, LB 1102, LB 1167, LB 1040 and LB 1052. Mainelli also noted no Soft Match Funds are being allowed to be used at this time. Mainelli reported they are being re-audited on Federal Projects in which the original audit had false statements according to Mainelli, who wrote a letter in protest of the findings and was awarded a re-audit. Nuckolls County only had one of those projects that will be re-audited. Warren discussed with Mainelli about determining the starting point for County Road Right-of-Ways.

Tim Schmidt, County Attorney met with the Board to inform them of a letter sent from TERC amending the hearing to allow each side 1 hour to present their case. The TERC Hearing will be in April.

FEBRUARY 6, 2012 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, February 6, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of January 30, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the January 30, 2012 minutes as submitted. The following correspondence was submitted to the Board in advance of the meeting: The CASA Advocate Newsletter for February 2012.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to accept the County Clerk, District Court and County Treasurer's January 2012 Board Reports as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Clerk Kassebaum remitted the January 2012 Aggregate Stop/Loss Report from Mid-American Benefits, Inc. for the 2011/2012 Employee Insurance. Currently we are at 52.1% Loss ratio. Kassebaum requested to purchase a basic black/white inkjet printer for the public access computer. The printer will only print documents from the Register of Deeds program. The Board gave their approval.

Susan Rogers, County Assessor met with the Board to announce employee Lisa Kovanda has passed the examination required to be a County Assessor and/or Deputy. Kovanda has been promoted to Deputy County Assessor. Rogers also announced that she has hired Elizabeth Sauce as a part-time employee who will work 2 days a week or more when needed. Rogers discussed the Ag land values for 2012/2013.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to discuss the current activities of the County Road Department. Also present is Mark Mainelli, of Mainelli Wagner Assoc. Warren noted they did snow removal on Sunday and will continue with snow removal this week. Warren announced they would be working 7:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. until the snow has been cleaned up. After the snow removal is complete they will be doing repairs and maintenance on the motorgraders and etc. in the Nelson shop. Warren gave Combs an update on the current status with concerns with the BN Rail Road. It was noted they R.R. will be putting in new rail sometime but no date was given. Warren reported he will have some of the road employees working this week on the ceiling in the County Judges office at the Courthouse. Warren reported on the amount of dollars Nuckolls County will be receiving in LPA Funds. This is for the Approximate Federal Fund Purchase Distribution based on current funding levels and 80% exchange rate for STP Funds \$47,287.20 and HBP Funds \$67,315.87 for a total amount of \$114,603.07. It was noted the HBP Funds amount changed from \$89,754.00 in May 2011. That is \$22,397.00 less. Warren also noted they are working on the sign inventory.

Mark Mainelli gave the Board an update on some current Legislative Bills that will affect the County Road Departments. Mainelli discussed LB 827, LB 1102, LB 1167, LB 1040 and LB 1052. Mainelli also noted no Soft Match Funds are being allowed to be used at this time. Mainelli reported they are being re-audited on Federal Projects in which the original audit had false statements according to Mainelli, who wrote a letter in protest of the findings and was awarded a re-audit. Nuckolls County only had one of those projects that will be re-audited. Warren discussed with Mainelli about determining the starting point for County Road Right-of-Ways.





Tim Schmidt, County Attorney met with the Board to inform them of a letter sent from TERC amending the hearing to allow each side 1 hour to present their case. The TERC Hearing will be in April.

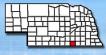

Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the March 19, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

County Treasurer Ensign met briefly with the Board to discuss the procedure on 2 Improvements on Leased Land that has the 2006 & 2007 taxes as unpaid and the owner has gone into bankruptcy. The Board asked the Treasurer to determine the ownership of the property that is on leased land and report back.

Clerk Kassebaum presented a correction of an increase from \$1,911.43 to \$2,004.73 due to completion of probation. All three board members approve the correction by signing the claim.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to accept the February 2012 Sheriff Report as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager/Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of both offices. Stutzman presented his increase of \$90.00 in salary due to him attaining his Pesticide Applicators License. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the \$90.00 increase in salary to start April 1, 2012 for Timothy Stutzman. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Stutzman informed the Board that there will be a Nuckolls County Severe Storm Spotters Training on April 9, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in Superior. The National Weather Service out of Hastings will be providing the instruction for this.





Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to discuss the current activities of the County Road Department.

Warren noted that he has been informed of the idea of tearing up the black top on County Road 2600 between the St. Stephens Catholic Church and the Cemetery in St. Stephens Precinct. The church board will be contacted also about this. No decision was made. The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the March 26, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

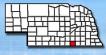
The following correspondence was submitted to the Board in advance of the meeting: A letter was received from the Nebraska State Historical Society regarding the announcement of the Superior City Hall and Auditorium being added to the National Register of Historic Places on March 12, 2012.

Clerk Kassebaum informed the Board of the need to replace sashes for 2 windows in the courthouse. One was broken and the other has a leak.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Certification of Receipt for Project No. HRRR-STWD (108). Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Warren discussed with the Board the agreement between Nuckolls County and Glenwood Telephone Co for the process to bury fiber optic lines in Nuckolls County. Warren noted the fiber optic lines are planned to be installed along Highway 14 Truck Route along the city limits of Superior and then east on county road C for a short distance. The agreement will be put on the agenda next week. Warren announced that all the county motorgrader are out on the county roads this week. When they finish the gravel roads they will then move to the dirt roads as the farmers are getting ready to go into their fields. The backhoe is in Garfield Precinct this week cleaning out road ditches. It will then be moved to Tom Ostdiek's to work on the head wall on tubes that are





there. Two of the gravel trucks are hauling gravel to county roads this week. Discussion was held on the quality of the gravel being hauled from the Superior pit. The Board was wondering what the State Specs were for gravel on county roads. Warren will look into this more. Warren informed the Board they are working on the headwalls for tubes being installed on the Hardy South Project in the County Shop. Warren let the Board know the lowboy trailer has been repaired. Warren informed the Board that Gordon Watts with John Deere has delivered the new skid steer. Warren notified the Board that Bridge #C0065(03410) has been removed from the bridge list with the State Department of Roads.

Mark Mainelli of Mainelli Wagner & Associates met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the state and federal activities which concern the county road departments. Mainelli noted a highway bill in Washington would put all federal funds in one pool for the state to be in charge of distributing the funds to the local governmental agencies. Mainelli noted that the state of Nebraska distributed funds prematurely according the Federal Audit on the FEMA Grants in 2010 including the Stimulus Grants for road & bridge structures. Nuckolls County had 1 road project and 2 storm disaster grants. These projects will possibly be under Federal Audit in the future. Mainelli discussed new ratings by the Federal Department of Roads for Bridge Structures and they will require new signs being posted.

At 10:00 a.m. the Board discussed having the Employee Insurance Policy plan sent to an outside source to have it reviewed. The intent of this is to correct any loopholes which may be looming in the future. Brown wanted the permission of the other two commissioners to have this done. Present for this discussion is Vicki Ensign; Susan Rogers and Royce Gonzales. Ensign asked who the policy holder is and the reply was the 3 board members as they are in control of decisions. Ensign asked if we would stay self insured and if we have to recognize the Obama Health Care Plan. Ensign wanted to know if the changes would be done by renewal time. The Board informed her that the plans are to have it done by renewal. As far as the other issues, they will let them know when it has been reviewed. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to authorize the Employee Insurance Plan to be sent off for review. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. Brown noted that Dan Swartzkopf, Krull Insurance Agency will be in charge of getting the manual reviewed. It was noted all employees will be required to sign off on receiving the new manual when completed or they will not be covered by the plan.

Chairman Combs requested authorization to pay Versitile Roofing to have the Courthouse Roof be assessed by an engineer to obtain the required information for the repairs which will be needed for the bids. The cost is \$1,900.00 for the roof assessment and \$1,200.00 for the Documentation Report. Present for this discussion is Vicki Ensign, Royce Gonzales and Timothy Schmidt. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to authorize Versitile Roofing to have the roof assessment and the legal documentation report done. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

The County Clerk, County Court, District Court and the Treasurer's March 2012 Board Reports were submitted to the Board. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to accept all reports as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.





The Board thanked Royce Gonzales, Clerk of the District Court for doing the County Government Day. Ensign reported that the State Auditor's office is recommending the County's to eliminate unused funds for the next budget year and Ensign recommends eliminating the Extension Sinking Fund and possibly the Federal Grant for Sheriff Fund.

Clerk Kassebaum reported on the new County Flag having a blemish on all three that was ordered. Flagsource reported the artwork that was submitted was flawed. They suggested the County should have the artwork fixed and they would reprint new flags at cost value. Clerk Kassebaum recommended Chris McKee, Hastings College Arts Degree Graduate to look at the original submitted digital artwork to see if it is fixable.

A Demand for Refund of Taxes paid, due to clerical error by taxing officials or taxpayer, or for refund of illegal taxes paid was submitted by Lee Fintel for a computer which was on his 2011 personal property schedule and should not have been. The computer is located in Lancaster County. The amount requested for refund is \$14.52. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to authorize a refund to Lee Fintel in the amount of \$14.52. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Vicki Ensign, County Treasurer and Susan Rogers County Assessor met with the Board to discuss the 2006 & 2007 back taxes owed on 2 bins which were on leased land in 2006 & 2007. The Board did not make any decisions at this time.

Ensign requested information regarding the building recently purchased by the City of Superior. There are back taxes from 2007, 2008 and 2009 due and Ensign wanted to know who is responsible for these taxes. The Board referred her to the City of Superior.

Ensign also requested information regarding another "Improvements on Leased Land" which has back taxes due and the land has been sold to a different owner and no change was filed in the County Assessor's office for ownership of the improvement. The Board recommended having her check into it more. Ensign asked who was in charge of taking care of the weeds around the courthouse in the gardens. No one is currently doing this. No one volunteered for this duty.

Warren noted the motorgrader operators have all the motorgraders out working the gravel and dirt roads this week. Two gravel trucks are hauling gravel this week in the South part of the County. They are still building headwalls in the Nelson shop for the Hardy South Project along the County line south of Hardy. It was noted Jewell County, Kansas are cleaning ditches on their side. It was noted that the Road Department will be working on installing, replacing driveway tubes this week. Warren noted he took 4 road project files to have them reviewed to see if we have all documentation for the Federal Audit. Warren is working with Clay County regarding Bridge Structure C0065(230), located on the county line road. Warren discussed with the Board about purchasing a grapple for the skidsteer. Warren received two quotes. Murphy Tractor for \$7,719.00 and Nebraska Machinery for \$7,490.00. Warren will order the grapple from Nebraska Machinery.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Nuckolls County Utility Agreement between Glenwood Telephone Membership Corporation for procedure on buried fiber optic toll cable for the Superior area. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Buescher discussed with the Board a request from Lawrence/Nelson Animal Science Class. The class is having a Community Improvement Extravaganza they would like to volunteer to do any project in the City of Nelson. It was discussed that the Road Department did not have any thing for them, however the Courthouse does. They could clean the flower beds and plant flowers in the flower pots. They are asking for more volunteers to help. They will have volunteers work in 3 hour shifts.





An error was discovered on two claims from last week. Clerk Kassebaum asked the Board to sign 2 different claims to Superior Motor Parts and NAPA Auto Parts that will correct the error. There is no additional money requested.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager/Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board to give updates on the current activities of both offices. Stutzman is in full mode for Noxious Weeds. He is currently working on contacting land owners who have noxious weeds. Stutzman attended the Noxious Weed Spring Training last week. Stutzman noted they are looking at CRP ground for noxious weeds and are getting more pro-active with Invasive weeds. Stutzman noted that Nuckolls County is now in a new ECO Region called Mixedgrass Prairie Ecoregion. Stutzman showed the board a list of weeds on the watch list that is not classified as a noxious weed. Stutzman reported some leafy spurge in the northern part of the county along the county line.

Stutzman reminded the Board of the Storm Spotters training meeting is tonight at 7:00 p.m. in Superior.

Clerk Kassebaum reported that Chris McKee of Lawrence has submitted a bill for the repairs to the county flag design for \$100.00. The Board gave their o.k. Clerk Kassebaum discussed the cost for air purifiers for the courthouse. They requested to have more research done on this.

Clerk Kassebaum announced that Amy Mazour has been promoted to Deputy County Clerk effective April 1, 2012.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to approve the application which authorizes the use of alcohol at a graduation party at the Nuckolls County Fairgrounds on May 5, 2012 for the following parents: Teena & Greg Kucera; Cathy & Roger Biltoft; Sherry & Duane Himmelberg and Kely Gewecke and Richard Kahman. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Derek Clark from the City of Superior did not show for the 10:00 session to discuss the updates on the 8th Street Bridge Project and the demolition project for the Telesis building (doll house) in Superior. They will reschedule next week.

There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 10:12 a.m. until Monday, April 16, 2012.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, April 16, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of April 9, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the April 9, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. The Hardy volunteer fire department was called out for road 4300 by Hardy which was flooded after the rain storm on Saturday. The road department was called in to barricade the road off until the flood waters receded. Warren discussed the repairs needed for that portion of the road. Warren noted they have been removing trees from county road ditches, installing driveway tubes and all motorgraders have been out blading the roads last week. This week the road department will be busy in the south portion of the county working on the cleanup from the rain storm from the weekend. They will be hauling gravel this week. Warren noted the headwalls are done for Project C0065(333). Tubes for projects C0065(142) and C0065(601) are in and will be delivered this week. On Friday Warren, Buescher, Bolte and 2 other road employees will be attending a sign training in Kearney. They will be finishing painting the lines in the courthouse parking lot this week.

The Board requested to have a couple of road employees fix some holes in the courthouse roof to temporarily stop the roof from leaking. Last Saturday's rain storm caused some extensive water leaks in the courthouse. The Board recessed to view the damage at 9:17 a.m. and reconvened at 9:20 a.m.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Windstream Communications plan with Nuckolls County to have Windstream Nebraska, Inc to replace a communications facility in Section 29, T2N-R8W (Alban Precinct), near Superior. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to authorize Chairman Combs to sign both the Electrical Line Easement request and Water line Easement request by Steve Gebers located between





Sections 18 & 19, T1N-R7W (Beaver Precinct). Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to accept the Nuckolls County Sheriff's Board Report for March 2012. Brown, Combs and Corman all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Vicki Ensign, County Treasurer and County Clerk, Kassebaum met with the Board to discuss having MIPS administer an "Offsite Backup System" for the County Treasurer and County Clerk's office. The offsite backup system will benefit if the courthouse were ever involved in a tornado or fire, etc.. The backup system will cost \$5.00 per week for each office. Clerk Kassebaum also discussed having MIPS administer the County's website. Kassebaum noted the cost is \$450.00 setup fee and \$50.00 a month for administering and maintenance of the website. A motion was made by Combs and seconded by Brown to authorize MIPS to provide Nuckolls County Treasurer and County Clerk's office the "Offsite Backup System" at the cost of \$10.00 a week and also to have MIPS provide Nuckolls County with a website at the cost of \$450.00 for setup fees and \$50.00 a month for administration and maintenance of the County Website. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Treasurer, Ensign updated the Board of the issue of the 2006 and 2007 taxes owed on bins which were located on leased land. Ensign noted the clause in the Notice of Publication stated "property will be sold subject to any existing real estate taxes on the subject property whether delinquent or accruing." The Board determined the new owner of the property is responsible for those back taxes. Ensign noted she will let the County Attorney foreclose on the property. The total amount due is \$895.62.

Treasurer Ensign requested to have Karen Thayer work in the County Treasurer's office on April 30, 2012 as that is the last day of Real Estate taxes are due and as the courthouse will be closed on April 27, 2012 due to the holiday of Arbor Day and she will be gone that day due to personal reasons. The Board gave their permission to hire her as temporary part time help.

Discussion was held regarding the repairs to the original design for the Nuckolls County Flag. The repairs have been done and Clerk Kassebaum was requesting permission to reorder new flags using the repaired design. Durable Flags from Elkhorn Nebraska had the original flags printed. The design flaw was not discovered until the flags were delivered to the Courthouse. Durable Flags has agreed to reprint the flags as cost value. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to send the repaired flag design to Durable Flags for 3 new flags. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.





Tim Schmidt, County Attorney met briefly with the Board to give an update on the TERC Case held last Thursday, April 12, 2012. Schmidt noted no decision has been made at this time and it may be some time before the rule as they have a large workload. The hearing lasted approximately 2 hours and 45 minutes. The TERC Board consisted of 2 Judges.

The Board requested Schmidt's determination on the 2006 & 2007 back taxes owed on the bins which were located at the time on leased land. Schmidt noted the taxes would follow the bins. Schmidt also noted he would probably start foreclosure sometime this fall and official notice should be made.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, April 23, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of April 16, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the April 16, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren noted all the motorgraders are out blading the county gravel roads and all the gravel trucks are out hauling gravel. Warren informed the Board that the Foreman and dirt crew were on Road X between Road 2800 & Road 2900 to relay a culvert pipe. Warren has been working with Clay County Roads Department on Project C-65(678) which is located on Road AA, between Roads 2500 & 2600. Warren noted that five road department employees and one Commissioner attended the Nirma Seminar in Kearney which discussed Road Liability. They are Warren, Buescher, Menke, Thornton, Culbertson and Brown.

Buescher noted she has been working on the Right of Way documents for County Project C-65(333), Superior West. This will be bid on May 14, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. at the Nuckolls County Courthouse. The plans have been received from Speece Lewis Engineers and are available for viewing.

Warren noted all the Projects that were being audited by the Federal Highway Department were approved which has released the funds. This in turn has released the Soft Match credits to be allowed to be used for the 8th Street Project in Superior and may also be used for the Fracture Critical Bridge Inspections.

Warren discussed the procedure he uses to obtain quotes on tubes when he is getting prices for tubes and road signs. Warren noted that last week the pup trailer was in the Nelson shop for repairs and they discovered additional problems. Warren submitted pictures of the cracks in the frame work. Due to the extent of the damage Warren found a used pup trailer for \$10,000.00. After some discussion the Board authorized Warren to purchase the used pup trailer and keep the old pup for parts.





Buescher discussed the clean up day (Nelson Community Improvement Extravaganza) held on Saturday, April 21, 2012 by the Lawrence Nelson Animal Science class. Buescher and Commissioner Combs were both in attendance as volunteers. The class pulled weeds at the Courthouse among other places in town.

A request for an Easement for Electrical Line was submitted by Stan Meyer. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the request for an Easement for Electrical Line by Stan Meyer located between Section 29 & 28, T1N- R6W (Garfield Precinct). Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Royce Gonzales, District Court Clerk met with the Board to present a picture which is being donated by the Nelson Masonic Lodge. Gonzales noted the history of the picture and then explained the symbols which represent the Free Masons, which is a fraternal organization. After some discussion the Board determined to respectfully decline the picture. Gonzales discussed that the Nelson Library or the Nuckolls County Museum would possibly accept the donation.

Clerk Kassebaum discussed several issues. The county received a check for the insurance claim on the sheriff's vehicle, an update on the progress of the County Flag. She also discussed the change of the administration of the Nuckolls County Website from the State of Nebraska to MIPS. It will be approximately 2 weeks to have the change over completed. Kassebaum also noted with legislature passing bills LB 995 & LB 735 the open meetings act has been changed. New posters will be provided by NACO.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager and Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board to give an update on both offices. Stutzman has been busy checking out complaints of noxious weeds within the County. Several areas in the Northern part of Nuckolls County were addressed.

Stutzman gave an update on the Storm Spotter Training held in Superior. It was noted that Commissioner Brown attended the Training. Stutzman discussed some issues of who is to make the call to sound the sirens. The Board noted that between the Emergency Manager and the Emergency 911 Manager they should be working together to make that decision.

Discussion was held regarding purchasing air purifiers for the courthouse. In attendance for this discussion is Royce Gonzales, Diane Wehrman, Vicki Ensign and Susan Rogers, who are all Elected Officials for the County. Concerns were made regarding mold in the courthouse due to water coming from the roof. Prices were





submitted at \$399.00 for a MA 2000 Mountaineer by SunHeat or \$499.00 for a MA 3500 Mountaineer. It was also noted that if we purchase 10 or more the cost would be \$199.00 for the MA2000 and \$259.00 for the MA 3500. The Board did not think it necessary to purchase 10 or more. They determined to have Chairman Combs and Clerk Kassebaum do more research to find a more cost competitive price for the air purifiers. As the Board will not be meeting until May 7, 2012, it was determined to allow Chairman Combs to make a decision on the purchase once they have determined a good purchase. It is allowed to purchase 3 or 4 air purifiers. Discussion was held regarding the roof damage.

Derek Clark, from the City of Superior met with the Board to discuss the old doll house building which is located at 139 E. 4th in Superior. The City and Nuckolls County had an agreement between them for the razing of the building. Clark submitted a bill for \$50,000.00 per agreement for the County's portion of the cost.

Clark also discussed the 8th Street Project in Superior which he is the RC for the Bridge Project. The NEPA document has been approved. Clark is very optimistic on the project being completed. He is looking at the project being bid on August 31, 2012. It was noted the Soft Match funds are free to be used on the Project.

County Attorney, Tim Schmidt met briefly with the Board. The Board discussed if the damage to the courthouse roof may be handled as an "Emergency" due to the extent of the continued damage. The roof is leaking in many places and the damage is much worse than first thought. Schmidt determined that the roof damage will qualify as an Emergency and therefore does not require the bidding process. The time frame to bid the project out could have the potential for more extensive damage due to weather. Therefore this constitutes an emergency and therefore circumvents the bidding process. He will advise the Board to do so as soon as paperwork is received and approved.

The Board recessed at 10:45 for Board of Equalization.

The Board reconvened at 11:36 a.m. The Board will then recess to do the Quarterly Jail Inspection and recess until Monday, May 7, 2012.

The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the April 23, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Mark Mainelli of Mainelli Wagner, Associates was also present for the meeting. Warren noted the Road Department has 4 motorgraders out blading gravel roads this week. They will have 3 gravel trucks with pup trailers hauling rock from Kansas. Project C-65(678) located between Nuckolls County and Clay County should be completed Monday or Tuesday of this week. Warren noted that he will be having Hein Construction do the crack sealing on the Superior South paved road. Discussion was held regarding the Hardy South Project C-65(638). Pipes have been set and they are hauling dirt in. When the Hardy South project is complete they will move equipment over to Project C-65(671), located on Road 4300 between the State Line and Highway 8. They will be replacing tubes and correcting the drainage issues. The Road Department is working on constructing headwalls for Projects C-65(412) and C-65(601), Southeast of Nelson. Warren noted the grapple has been delivered and has been attached to the loader. Warren announced there will be two bids on the agenda next week for culverts for Project C-65(333), located on Road C from 2720 to 2750 and Project C-65(572) located at 3740 Road 3700.

An Easement request was received from Steve Crookshanks for permission to bury and electrical line under a county road and county road ditch located between Section 20 and 17, T3N-R5W. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve the request. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to approve Resolution 5-7-2012 for Nuckolls County to request the Board of Public Roads Classification and Standards to grant approval for the proposed construction on culvert pipes to replace the existing timber bridge on the Minimum Maintenance, County Road E between Section 7 and 18, T1N-R6W. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. This is on County Project c-65(572).





Mainelli noted that not a lot of action is going on at the State Department of Roads regarding politics. Mainelli noted that the Federal Highway Department is working on the Federal Aide Project issues. The Nebraska Bridge Department is redoing the Fracture Critical Bridge Inspection policy, which the cost is allowed through the Soft-Match Funds.

Vicki Ensign, County Treasurer met with the Board to review the Monthly Operating Statements for the County Treasurer's Office. Ensign reported they had received over a \$ 1,000,000.00 in real estates taxes have been paid which is 60.8% of the total taxes due, which leaves 39.2% left to pay. Ensign discussed if the Board would like to transfer any funds into the Road Department this month. The Board determined to wait until next week. Discussion was held regards budgeted funds for the Courthouse Roof repairs.

The County Court, County Clerk, District Court and County Treasurer all submitted the Monthly Board Reports for the month of April 2012. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to accept all reports as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Jim Rempe, President of the Nuckolls County Fairboard met with the County Board to submit a Special Designated Liquor License Application for the event on August 3, 2012 for a beer garden. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to approve the Special Designated Liquor License for the August 3, 2012 event. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. The license will then need to be sent to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission for final approval.

Miles Maddox, Versatile Roofing, Inc. met with the Board to review the quote submitted for the repairs to the Nuckolls County Courthouse roof. The original quote was for \$84,490.49. Different options were presented to the Board for discussion. The Shingles recommended are a Class 4 Impact resistance and will have a 40 year GAF, System Plus Warranty. Discussion was held on the possible repairs that may need done that would not be in the quote. Also discussed is the need for Versatile Roofing for traveling, lodging, etc. They will also need to have a 50 amp service for a Camper to be used as office and over night stays. The traveling cost was quoted at \$13,500.00. Discussion was also held regarding the painting that would need to be done at this time. Versatile Roofing recommended Kucera Painting. Maddox will contact them to get a quote. Maddox noted they would be able to start by May 29, 2012. The added costs to the original quote will be \$22,820.00. For a total bid of \$107,310.49 (This does not include the painting). County Attorney, Tim Schmidt who is present for the discussion noted the County will require a contract to be approved prior to starting the project. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman that due to the emergency situation and the nature of the continued damage to the inside of the courthouse due to the roof damage, Nuckolls County will tentatively hire Versatile Roofing, LLC of Kearney Nebraska to make the necessary repairs to the roof as agreed upon, subject to the review and approval of the final contract. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

MAY 21, 2012 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, May 21, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of May 14, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the May 14, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren noted that Project C-65(638), ½ mile south of Hardy in Section 31, T1N-R5W, should be complete today. They will be moving to Project C65 (671), County Road 4300 in Section 31, T1N-R5W. Warren is having 4 road employees working on county road signs this week and then others will be constructing headwalls for tubes in the Nelson shop. Warren gave the board an update on the accident involving a county road department pup-trailer in Kansas. Warren is having an employee mowing county road ditches to get ready for the memorial weekend. The County will be working in conjunction with the City of Superior on project C65 (675), 1 mile west of Superior on road 3400. They will be starting the armor coating project on May 29th to 31st. The Commissioners discussed the current budgeted expenditures with Warren and Buescher. Warren discussed the coordinated effort between Nuckolls County and Clay County on County Project C65 (678), on the North side of Section 6, T4N-R8W (Victor Precinct), Road AA between 2500 & 2600. The projected start date will be sometime this fall.

Clerk Kassebaum informed the Road Department and the Commissioners that she received notice from NEMA that FEMA Disaster 1674 is now closed. All funds have been paid and all documents have been reviewed. Nuckolls County received disaster funds from the Severe Winter Storm Disaster from December 19, 2006 to January 1, 2007.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to approve the request from Windstream Nebraska, Inc. to install communications facilities between Section 32, T3N-R5W and Section 5, T2N-R5W, near Ruskin. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to accept the County Sheriff's April 2012 Monthly Board Report as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

The Board requested to have Royce Gonzales present to discuss the Budget Making Authority. Clerk Kassebaum has requested to not be on the Budget Making Authority this year. Treasurer Ensign has requested to continue being on the Budget Making Authority. Ensign is not present for the discussion. The Board asked if Gonzales would be interested in being on the Budget Making Authority. Gonzales is definitely interested. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to hire Vicki Ensign and Royce Gonzales to be the Budget Making Authority for the fiscal year 2012/2013. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager and Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of both departments. Stutzman gave an update on the storm on Saturday, May 19, 2012 in Nuckolls County. It seems the communities of Hardy and Deweese saw some storm damage. Discussion held





regarding some concerns why the sirens were not blown. Stutzman discussed some noxious weeds found in the southeast part of the county and along the Republican River.

A phone conference was held with Miles from Versatile Roofing regarding the repairs of the Nuckolls County Courthouse Roof. Discussion was held regarding the contract with Versatile Roofing. The contract was submitted to their attorney for review and they have not received it back at this time. The discussion was tabled until later today.

Royce Gonzales met with the Board regarding the Safety Committee report. Gonzales reported on the minutes from the January 31, 2012 Safety Committee meeting. Gonzales noted the Safety Committee has adopted the Nirma Safety Manual for Nuckolls County. It was noted the Safety Committee did not meet in March as scheduled. June 21, 2012 is scheduled for the makeup meeting. Gonzales noted they have implemented a new attendance record. Members will be tracked for attendances. Gonzales discussed other issues with the Board and the Board requested copies of the minutes for all meetings and would like reports on safety committee recommendations on all possible issues that may cause potential claims. The Board will determine what changes can be made. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to accept the January 31, 2012 Safety Committee minutes as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Schmidt, County Attorney met with the Board to discuss the request from R.L. Schmeling regarding the grant application for the restoration of the Superior City Auditorium. Schmeling has requested to have Nuckolls County act as the LPA on the grant. The Board has asked Schmidt if he would be interested in acting as the LPA on behalf of Nuckolls County. Schmidt agreed. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to appoint Tim Schmidt as LPA on behalf of Nuckolls County, NE in the Grant being applied for by Superior Historic Redevelopment Corporation for the restoration of the Superior City Auditorium. All funds received will be funneled through Nuckolls County. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Diane Fowler, Executive Director of Midland Area Agency on Aging, Jolanda Bouray, Nuckolls County agent met with the Board. Diane Fowler introduced Gerald Gerdes as the new Executive Director of Midland Area Agency on Aging, effective May 1, 2012 as Fowler will be retiring. Fowler discussed the request of \$8,953.00 for support of the Midland Area Agency on Aging for fiscal year 2012/2013. Fowler noted this is an increase of \$47.00 from last fiscal year. The change is from the membership renewal fess of \$1.00 per person in Nuckolls County over age 60. The fees last year were \$0.95 per person. Also they are based on the U.S. Census Bureau's report for the 2010 census for Nuckolls County. The remaining amount of \$7475.00 is for program support and it is the same as last year. Nuckolls County has a Midland Area Agency on Aging location in Superior. This fee helps to support that location. Corman noted that Nuckolls County is very fortunate to have a location in Superior. It services Nuckolls County elderly with transportation, home delivered meals and other services. Fowler noted a change in the age group of over age 60 has changed in Nuckolls County. In 200 the group population was 1507 and now it is 1478 for 2010. Bouray reported the new handicap van which was purchased in November 2011 through Department of Revenue federal funds received over the years for reimbursed, eligible fuel tax fees. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to approve the 2012/2013 fiscal year budget request of \$8,953.00 to Midland Area Agency on Aging. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Chairman Combs recessed at 10:55 a.m. for Board of Equalization. Chairman Combs reconvened at 11:35 a.m. for regular session.

JUNE 4, 2012 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, June 4, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of May 21, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the May 21, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Also present is Jeff Wagner of Mainelli Wagner Associates, P.C. to discuss bridge projects with the Board. Warren discussed Project C-65(638), Project C-65(675) and Project C-65(671) as being complete and open. Warren noted that only 1 gravel truck is out hauling gravel to problem areas. The Road Department will be working on requests for driveway tubes soon. Project C-65(672), 1 mile south of Ruskin will start today, Monday, June 4, 2012. Discussion was held regarding Bridge #C006513220, located between Sections 16 & 17, T2N-R5W (Spring Creek Precinct), which was temporarily closed in 2008. Project C-65(601) located 1 mile south and 1 mile east of Nelson will be started this week. They will be replacing a wooden bridge with 2-72" culvert pipes. They will also be working on a maintenance project one and half miles north of Bostwick where they will be removing a wood WPA tube and replacing it with a new steel culvert. Warren noted that they are having the weeds sprayed around county road guardrails and signs this week. Warren informed the Board that he was given the ok from Nirma to proceed in getting the pup trailer fixed. The pup trailer was involved in an accident last month. Discussion was held regarding the main design, backwalls, etc. on Bridge C650000230 on the Clay/Nuckolls County line. Warren noted the paddle wagon was in the shop for repairs. They had to replace the main seal. Buescher noted she would be on vacation all next week. Warren will be at Highway Superintendents meetings part of next week.

Wagner reported on the issue of delays with Core Permits for any bridge projects. The Core of Engineers is giving concentration to the State Department of Roads projects. If Counties are in need of core permits they need to call the NRD's and the U.S.D.A. Fish & Wildlife to push the permits through. Wagner will be meeting with Clay County Highway Superintendent regarding the Bridge C650000230 on the Nuckolls/Clay County line. Warren noted he will be getting a quote from Hein Construction for the crack sealing on the Edgar Spur.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to approve the Easement For Electrical Line which was received from Meta Snyder, Fremont NE to run an electrical line under a county road and in the county road ditch between Sections 24 & 25, T2N-R5W. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Discussion was held regarding a Resolution that was presented for approval to release the Nuckolls County 911 data to the public for GPS purposes to NAVTEQ North America, LLC. The navigable geographical database would be used for public GPS systems which will show road names, addresses, etc. in Nuckolls County. Webster County submitted their sample of the agreement to the Nuckolls County Road Department. The agreement with NAVTEQ was table until next week.

Vicki Ensign and Royce Gonzales as the Budget Making Authority met with the Board and Warren and Buescher regarding the 2011/2012 and the 2012/2013 Road Budget. Discussion was in regard to the amount estimated that will be received in revenue and the estimated expenses for the end of the current budget and





beginning of the next fiscal years budget. The concerns are there may not be enough revenue coming in for July and August to support the Road Department until September 1st of the upcoming fiscal year. The County General budget may have to support the road department fund until the tax dollars come in. Currently 63% of the taxes for 2011 have been paid. The Treasurer does not anticipate much tax dollars coming in until September 1st. The Road Department will need to tighten the spending until then.

Ensign, Gonzales, Wehrman and Kassebaum were present to submit the monthly board reports for their offices. Ensign and Gonzales gave a report on their monthly reports. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to accept the County Clerk, County Court, District Court and Treasurer's May 2012 Board Reports. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

The Board inquired with the Budget Making Authority on the current status of getting a laptop purchased for the Commissioners that would be used for the budget process. The idea of the laptop would be to work on it in the Board room at the time of budget discussions. It was discussed about what brand of laptop that would be best. The estimated cost may be up to \$2,000.00.

County Assessor Rogers met with the Board to give the Board the 2012 Preliminary Valuation Figures as of Friday, June 1, 2012. The figures show a valuation increase of \$81,324,832 between 2011 and 2012. Real Estate valuation increase is \$73,086,255 and the Personal Property valuation increase is \$8,238,577. Rogers did not show any valuation change in Specials for 2012.

Rogers also met with the Board to request the purchase of 3 new office chairs for the Assessors office. Rogers submitted a quote from Eakes Office for \$295.00 per chair. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the purchase of 3 office chairs from Eakes Office Plus at the cost of \$295.00 for each chair. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Ensign met with the Board to discuss salary increases for the regular employees of Nuckolls County. Ensign submitted a worksheet that shows the current salary and then what the salary would be with a 50.00 increase, a 3%, 3.5%, 4% and a 4.5% increase. No decisions were made.

Ensign and County Assessor Rogers met with the Board to get approval of their annual agreements with GIS Workshop. Ensign's agreement is for taxes on line support. Rogers has 2 agreements, one is for maintenance of the assessor's programs and the other is for website support.

A motion was made by Combs and seconded by Corman to approve the agreement with GIS Workshop and the Nuckolls County Treasurer effective July 1, 2012 for Taxes On-line at the cost of \$1,000.00. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve both of the Maintenance and Support Services Agreements with GIS Workshop for the GISW Assessor programs, effective July 1, 2012 at the cost of \$2,500.00 and the Website support and maintenance, effective July 1, 2012 at the cost of \$2,500.00. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

The Board discussed with Rogers the Agreement that was presented earlier with NAVTEQ regarding the 911 GPS database. Rogers noted that GIS Workshop and Nuckolls County have an agreement in place that all requests for 911 and GPS info should go through them. The Board noted that Nuckolls County owns the information and should not release the information for free.





A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to appoint Derek Clark to the South Heartland District Health Department as a "public-spirited" Nuckolls County person. This appointment is to replace Perry Freeman who is resigning his position. The appointment will be to complete Perry Freeman's 3 year term which ends March 2015. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Discussion held regarding the revised Insurance Policy for Nuckolls County Employees as submitted. Present for this discussion is Tim Schmidt, Susan Rogers and Vicki Ensign. Schmidt and Rogers are on the Insurance Committee. The Insurance Policy Plan will be tabled until next Monday.

The Board received notice from the Trailblazer RC&D regarding the Tire Recycling Grant that they applied for. Nuckolls County is tentatively scheduled for a recycling pickup on August 4, 2012. The RC&D did not receive the full grant amount that was applied for.

A phone conference with Miles of Versatile Roofing was held regarding the courthouse roof repairs, which was scheduled to begin May 29th. They could not make that date and will deliver equipment and supplies today, June 4, 2012. They will begin work on Tuesday, June 5th.

The budget making authority met briefly with the Board to discuss the proper procedure for purchasing the laptop computer. It was decided they should use the county credit card.

JUNE 11, 2012 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, June 11, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of June 4, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the June 4, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren gave the current status on Project C-65 (672), 1 mile south of Ruskin. Warren noted gravel on the road by end of week and Project C-65(601) Southeast of Nelson and they are laying the tubes today. Also Discussion was held regarding Project C-65(656), bridge on Nuckolls/Clay County line. Headwalls are being constructed in the Nelson shop for project C-65(412), 2 miles south and 1 mile east of Nelson. The Scrapper is in the Nelson shop having the motor and radiator worked on. The Road Northeast of Bostwick has been completed. Warren noted that the stringers have been removed from a bridge that was temporarily closed, southwest of Ruskin. Warren brought in a stop sign that had been vandalized. He noted that 4 signs in the last 2 ½ weeks have been similarly vandalized. Warren discussed that a claim for \$11,700.00 for oil on resurface project by Superior and a claim for tubes on another bridge project that will need to be paid before the fiscal year end.

Discussion was held regarding the agreement with NAVTEQ regarding the request for 911 addresses for GPS Systems. Susan Rogers, County Assessor and Timothy Schmidt, County Attorney were both present for the discussion. Rogers noted that we have an agreement with GIS Workshop that all requests for 911 address info will need to go through them. The 911 address information is owned by Nuckolls County. Nuckolls County would then receive a portion of the fees submitted for the information provided to a requestor. Schmidt noted the document was not in proper form to be a contract or Resolution and does not recommend the Board to sign. Rogers agreed. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to deny the request from NAVTEQ. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Warren discussed Bridge #04330 which is located on Road 4600 between Highway 4 and Road Y, known as Project C65(631). Nuckolls County will be required to have an Interlocal Agreement with the USDA, Fish & Wildlife to proceed with the project. No action taken at this time.

Vicki Ensign and Royce Gonzales, the Budget Making Authority met with Warren and the Board to discuss the trend of Expenditures and Revenue for the past 5 years. A chart was submitted to give a more visible picture of the trend.

Warren discussed the contract with Metal Culverts, Inc for the agreement with the plans and specifications on project located in Section 21, T1N-R8W (Bostwick Precinct) in the amount of \$39,127.60. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the contract between Metal Culverts, Inc and Nuckolls County in the amount of \$39,127.60 on Project C-65(333) located in Section 21, T1N-R8W. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.





A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve a Water Line Easement request from Clarence Kimminau to run a water line under the county road and road ditch between Section 4 & 5, T2N-R8W (Alban Precinct). Combs, Corman & Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve a Internet Cable Easement request from Aurora Cooperative to run a 2" conduit with internet cable under the county road and road ditch between Section 4 & 5, T4N-R5W (Hammond Precinct). Combs, Corman & Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager/Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board briefly to give an update on the current activities of both offices. Stutzman discussed the vehicle used by him for the purpose of conducting business. He noted the differential is out and leaks fluid. He is requesting to have this repaired. Also the tires are showing some wear. Stutzman also discussed some issues with the EMPG report. He is getting these issues resolved. Stutzman also discussed some noxious weeds that he has discovered in the county.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Subgrant Agreement between Nuckolls County Clerk of the District Court and the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services Division of children and Family Services Child Support Enforcement which extends the previous agreement to an additional 3 month period effective until September 30, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Dan Swartzkopf, Krull Insurance Agency met with the Board and the Insurance Committee (Susan Rogers, Timothy Schmidt, Jim Bolte & Jean Stichka) to discuss the revised Employee Insurance Summary Plan Description as submitted. No major changes were made. The format is different however. Rogers noted some inconsistencies with the wordage in some of the descriptions. There was some clarification on co pay's and coinsurance. Discussion was also held regarding the disclaimer, Behavioral Exclusions, retiree rates, etc. Swartzkopf gave some explanations to all issues. It was determined that Swartzkopf will get back with Mid-American Benefits to get more clarification of the issue questioned. The Summary Plan will be tabled until next week. It was determined that no reduction in retiree rates is given.

Swartzkopf also discussed the renewal rates as submitted. There is a 7% increase in fixed costs (administrative) and a 10% decrease in funding costs. Overall there is a 3% decrease in costs for the Employee Insurance. The monthly expected cost for a single coverage is \$556.93; 2-party coverage is \$996.33 and the family coverage is \$1,488.12. These rates are the premiums that are paid by both the employee and the County. The current medical trend is 10% to 12% increase. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the renewal fees as submitted by HCC Life for the fiscal year 2012/2013. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Sharon Hueffle, South Central Economic Development District met with the Board to update them on the past years activities in Nuckolls County. Hueffle also noted the dues will not change from last year.

Ron Fryda, USDA, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Wildlife Services met with the Board to request approval of the Agreement for the Wildlife Damage Management program effective July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013. The amount for this service is \$7,645.00. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the renewal of the Agreement between Nuckolls County and the Wildlife Services for Wildlife Damage Management in the amount of \$7,645.00 for July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.





Scott Stemper, Executive Director of Area Substance & Alcohol Abuse Prevention Coalition which services Adams, Clay, Nuckolls & Webster Counties. Stemper discussed what ASAAP does within these counties to help with drug & alcohol prevention. Stemper noted that 2 of the 4 grants that they usually receive totaling \$275,000.00 will be going away. Stemper is requesting Nuckolls County and the other 3 counties to help support this program for 1 year until additional grants can be applied for and received. Stemper is requesting \$5,000.00 for a 1 time support towards ASAAP from Nuckolls County. The Board determined to table the request until they determine how the budget talks will go for the new fiscal year. They requested Stemper to return on July 23, 2012 to the County Board meeting to get a decision.

There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 11:57 a.m. until Monday, June 18, 2012.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, June 18, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of June 11, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the June 11, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren commented that the road department may be assisting VanKirk Brothers Construction with the lagoon ponds in Nelson. All motorgraders will be out this week blading the gravel roads in the county. The Road Department is cleaning out some culvert pipes which have been blocked by debris through the county. The County is continuing work on Projects C-65(601) and C-65(672). Warren discussed some repairs made to some county owned equipment last week. Warren presented an agreement with Mainelli Wagner Associates, Inc. regarding plan design for Bridge #C006500230 Nuckolls Clay County line. The agreement was tabled until next Monday, June 25, 2012. Warren reported on the Highway Superintendents meeting in Valentine last week. They discussed LB 84 which adds .05 sales tax for State Highway Improvement approved by the Governor on May 18, 2012. Discussion also held regarding the Inheritance Tax, LB 740 (hay hauling to 59.5'). Senator Christiansen talked about fence on county row with a 30 day notice. 1&6 Year Reports may be going to electronic reporting next year. Warren noted that Counties may still receive some state aide to bridge projects, CDL drivers and their responsibilities to be safe drivers, LTAP discussed reflectrometry for road signs.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to approve the renewal rates for the fiscal year 2012-2013 to Nirma & Nirma II in the amount of \$77,251.00. Clerk Kassebaum gave an update on LB14 and what requirements will need to be done to comply. LB 14 was approved by the Governor and will become effective January 1, 2013. This will increase the recording fees for records in the Register of Deeds from \$5.00 for the first page to \$10.00 and each additional page is \$6.00. There will no longer be an indexing fee. These fees will stay in effect until 2018. \$2.50 of the \$10.00 fee and \$0.50 of the \$6.00 will be put into a Maintenance & Preservation Fund to be use exclusively for the preservation and maintenance of the documents recorded in the Register of Deeds Office.

The Insurance Summary Plan for the Nuckolls County Employee Insurance was discussed, which Assessor Rogers commented on some issues she wanted more clarification on. Commissioner Brown gave his determination of the issue. The County's Insurance Agent, Dan Swartzkopf, Krull Insurance Agency was not present for the discussion. The Board tabled the Insurance Plan until next week.

Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the April 16, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Martin Pohlman of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren noted that Project C-65(601) is still in construction. They will be moving to Bostwick Precinct next to start cutting trees for Project C-65 (333), located on Road BC between 2720-2750. They are finishing the requests for driveway tubes this week. Unit #92 is in the Nelson shop for a new water pump. They are done with Project C-65 (650), re-grading Road D from 3150 to 3200, NW of Bostwick. Warren announced the Road Department will be having a Safety Meeting on Tuesday. All blades are out on the county roads this week maintaining the gravel and dirt roads. Warren noted that the road south of Ruskin is open. Warren noted the test results should be in soon on the beam sample that was taken. A **motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Agreement between Mainelli Wagner & Associates, Clay County and Nuckolls County. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.**

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to authorize Chairman Combs to sign a request from Windstream Nebraska, Inc. for plans to replace communications facility in Section 23, T1N-R7W (Beaver Precinct) north of 15th Street Bridge as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Clerk Kassebaum gave an update on the status of the County Flags being re-printed to correct a flaw in the design work. The purchase order is for \$289.85. Durable Flags is reprinting the flags and giving the County a discount of \$79.85. The reprinted cost is \$227.50 which includes shipping and handling. Nirma informed the Board that they are going to be submitting information electronically through the Nirma Portal for future





communications. They are also implementing a new coverage to Counties which will be an accidental life insurance plan benefit for volunteers who work for the Member Counties. The benefit limit is \$10,000. Also the new website for Nuckolls County will be available for review soon. The website address will not change from the current address of <u>www.nuckollscounty.ne.gov</u>.

Vicki Ensign and Royce Gonzales, the Budget Making Authority met with the Board to inform them that they have purchased a Samsung Series 7 Laptop computer for the use of preparing the budget. They purchased the laptop from BestBuy for \$950.00 plus \$100.00 for Microsoft Office program and plus warranty & maintenance service for a total cost of \$1,250.00. Ensign and Gonzales also requested to purchase the Bosonova Program (AS400) for \$150.00 from Mips, who provide us with the program for the budget. The Board gave their approval to purchase the Bosonova Program from Mips for \$150.00.

Clerk Kassebaum submitted a Resolution to transfer \$5,500.00 to the County Attorney's budget from the County General Miscellaneous fund. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to approve the Resolution to transfer funds to the County Attorney's fund budget from County General Miscellaneous Fund. RuAnn Root, Executive Director of CASA met with the Board to request \$3,500.00 for the support of CASA for the fiscal year of 2012/2013. Root also gave a brief update on the activities that happened in Nuckolls County during last year. Root submitted a Mission Statement, Contact list and a budget request worksheet which shows the request for \$3,500.00. It also shows additional budgeted income and expenses for CASA for 2012/2013. Root announced a new program that CASA is advocating called TLC for children ages 18 to 24. They will be purchasing the Mary Lanning Dormitory in Hastings and plan to start renovations middle August and plan to finish in August 2013. As a supporter to CASA Nuckolls County youth will be eligible to utilize the TLC Program and its facilities and resources. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to accept the budget request for \$3,500.00 for the fiscal year 2012/2013. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Chairman Combs recessed at 9:59 for County Board of Equalization. Chairman Combs reconvened the regular session meeting at 12:42 p.m.

Jim Rempe, President of the Nuckolls County Ag Society, Marlan Watson, CPA for the Ag Society and Nick Elledge; Angie Gardner; Neal Bouray; Darren Ostdiek and Scott Meyer all board members of the Nuckolls County Ag Society met with the County Board of Commissioners to request the County to approve a request for Nuckolls County to give levy authority to the Nuckolls County Agricultural Society for the fiscal year of 2012-2013 in the amount of \$45,521 for the General Fund and \$24,151 for the Sinking Fund. The County Board requested to see the financial records for the Ag Society. Watson discussed the financial records as was submitted. Discussion was held regarding the reason why the ballot question for the Ag Society did not pass. The consensus was the language on the ballot did not explain the issue well and it was not advertized. It was explained the only resource the Ag Society has for any kind of funding for the 2012/2013 fiscal year is to request to approve the Ag Society to receive any kind of tax dollars to help support them. It was noted the Ag Society is responsible for the Nuckolls County Fair among other things. Watson said they may still be able to have the County Fair this year with the funds they currently have but they would not be able to fund the County





Fair in the future. Without receiving tax dollars this year the Ag Society would be broke and would be done. The Board noted the Ag Society will need to get back on the ballot for November and request the tax dollars from the voters again. If it does not pass in November they will determine then the voters of Nuckolls County does not want to support the Ag Society or County Fair. In order to be on the ballot in November the Ag Society will be required to do a petition which will require 5% of the registered voters to show they want the issue on the November ballot. However this will not be in time for the current fiscal year and would be for 2013/2014 fiscal year and up to 5 consecutive years. The issue of the 2012/2013 is still not resolved. Concerns and questions were discussed as to why this is just now being questioned. It was noted that the Ag Society is a municipality of the County and is allowed to be under the County's \$.50 cent lid levy. With some changes at the Ag Society it was brought to the County's attention. The Board determined to table the decision until next week to review all documents that were submitted. Discussion was also held regarding if the County would give levy allocation to the Ag Society would they be under the County's authority. It was determined to call the State Auditor and find out. No decision was made at this time and it will be addressed again next Monday.

Dan Swartzkopf, Krull Insurance Agency and County Insurance Agent met with the Board and the Insurance Committee regarding the Summary Plan Description for the County Employees Insurance Plan. The members of the Insurance Committee present are Tim Schmidt and Susan Rogers. Swartzkopf explained the wordage for the Podiatry question and the pregnancy guideline that was previously questioned. The County will be required to print new Employee Insurance Manuals for each employee and it was requested to have Mid-American Benefits do the printing. A return receipt will be required from each employee when distributed. Swartzkopf explained the new dental premiums that were decided on. The new rates are reduced as the dental claims from last year were much less than what the amount that it was being funded for. The funding will be allocated to the medical. The Insurance Committee members present were in favor of approving the revised issue of the Employee Insurance Plan Description for the Employee Insurance Benefit. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Schmidt, County Attorney presented a Resolution for Approval of Change in the Safety Training Option Program (S.T.O.P.) The change is to change the requirement from 8 hour course to a 4 hour course. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the Resolution for Approval of Change in the Safety Training Option Program (S.T.O.P.). Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager met briefly with the Board. Stutzman had put the repairs for the Emergency Managers vehicle on the agenda, however he missed the appointment with the garage for the estimate on what was wrong and how much it would cost to fix. So Stutzman did not have any thing to discuss with the Board.

Ensign received a return call from Deann Haefner from the State Auditor's office regarding the Ag Society. Haefner answered some questions for the Ag Society and the County. Haefner noted that procedures with paying claims, etc would not change if the County allowed the Ag Society to be under the County's levy authority. Haefner will send an email to verify this information. The Ag Society's board and Watson were present also for the phone conference with Haefner.

There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 2:06 p.m. until Monday, July 2, 2012.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda with changes to the 11:00 a.m. bid letting, removing the dates, and the June 25, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Vicki Ensign, County Treasurer met briefly with the Board. Ensign submitted her end of fiscal year Revenue report and the June 2012 monthly report. Ensign also discussed the scheduling for preparing the 2012/2013 budget. Budget meetings with the Elected Officials and Department Heads will be on August 6, 2012.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren noted all motorgraders are out on the county roads blading. A road employee will be mowing in the Superior area this week. Project C65 (601), located South of Nelson is continuing with the construction. Warren updated the Board on a change to the plans. The road guys will be working on inventory. Royce Gonzales, District Court Clerk met briefly with the Board to present his Monthly Board Report. Also submitted is the County Court, County Clerk's Board Reports. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to accept the County Treasurer, District Court, County Court and the County Clerk's June 2012 Monthly Board Reports as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A letter was submitted for the Board from the Little Blue NRD regarding the Environmental Tire Recycling Grant for Nuckolls, Thayer & Clay Counties. The total grant is for 177 tons to be split between the 3 Counties. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the tentative date of August 11, 2012 for the Nuckolls County Tire Recycling Pickup, located at the Nelson Road Department. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Susan Rogers, County Assessor met with the Board to submit a Letter of Understanding between Executive Copier Systems, Inc. and Eakes Office Plus. Executive Copier Systems, Inc. has sold their business to Eakes Office Plus. Eakes Office Plus will honor the maintenance service contract between Executive Copier Systems, Inc and Nuckolls County for the copier in the County Assessor's office through the contract period. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Letter of



Understanding between Executive Copier Systems, Inc. and Eakes Office Plus for the Maintenance Service Contract for the copier in the County Assessor's office. Combs, Corman & Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

At 10:15 a.m. the Nuckolls County Agricultural Society Board Members met with the Commissioners to decide if the Ag Society would be allowed to receive levy authority under the County's budget for the fiscal year 2012/2013. The Ag Society met last week and submitted a Resolution asking for Tax request under General Fund of \$45,521 and Sinking Fund of \$24,151. Discussion was held and the Ag Society noted that this request is the same as last year. Present for this Ag Society is Jim Rempe, Angie Gardner, Darren Ostdiek, Scott Meyer, Nick Elledge and Neal Bouray. Also present is Marlan Watson, CPA, budget preparer for the Ag Society. It was noted that the Board is requesting the Ag Society to get the request to the voters in the November Election. The Board also noted if the levy request does not pass in November, the Board will not support the Ag Society in the future. It is noted the Ag Society conducts the Nuckolls County Fair, 4-H Activities, the upcoming concert in August, etc. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to approve the levy request for \$45,521 in General Fund and \$24,151 for Sinking Fund for the fiscal year 2012/2013. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager and Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board to discuss the repairs needed for the Tahoe, the county vehicle used expressly for the Emergency Manager/Noxious Weed Superintendent. Stutzman noted the repairs would cost approximately \$400 to \$500 dollars to fix the front differential. It was also noted the Tahoe needed new tires and a front end alignment. It was noted the Tahoe has approximately 175,000 miles on it. The Board authorized Stutzman to have the repairs made to the Tahoe as needed. They would like to keep it under the \$500.00 estimate. Stutzman also discussed the yellow flowered weed that was discovered earlier. Stutzman noted it was called 'birds foot trefoil' and it is not on the noxious weed list or watch list.

Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

At 11:00 a.m. a bid letting was held for the Appraisal of 475 Residential Properties in the Towns of Lawrence and Nelson. Present is Susan Rogers, County Assessor. One bid proposal was submitted by Stanard Appraisal Services Inc of Central City, Nebraska. The proposal amount is for \$49, 875.00. Rogers noted this was the same amount as last year per parcel. A motion was made by Corman and seconded Brown to approve the bid proposal by Stanard Appraisal Services Inc. in the amount of \$49,875.00 for the appraisal services for residential properties in Lawrence and Nelson. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

At 11:15 a.m. a bid letting was held for the Maintenance Appraisal Services for the Nuckolls County Assessor's office for the period of September 1, 2012 to August 31, 2013 to consist of a total of 30 days in the fiscal year. Present is Susan Rogers, County Assessor. One bid proposal was submitted by Stanard Appraisal Services, Inc. of Central City, Nebraska. The proposal amount is for \$21,360.00. Any additional days will be billed at \$89.00 per hour. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to accept the bid proposal by Stanard Appraisal Services Inc. in the amount of \$21,360.00 for maintenance services for the Nuckolls County Assessor's Office for the period of September 1, 2012 to August 31, 2013. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.





At 11:30 a.m. the board heard from the Elected Officials and Department Heads regarding salary increases for the regular employees to begin January 1, 2013. Present are Tim Schmidt, County Attorney; Susan Rogers, County Assessor; Jackie Kassebaum, County Clerk; Royce Gonzales, Clerk of the District Court; Jim Marr, County Sheriff; Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent; Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary for the Road Department; Phyllis Schoenholtz, Extension Agent and Jean Stichka, Office Manager for the County Extension Office and Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager/Noxious Weed Superintendent. Schmidt discussed with the Board that \$75.00 would be a nice raise for the employees and currently the county is in good shape financially. The Board discussed that if the regular employees received \$75.00 then the Deputies would want \$75.00 and per resolution they are only receiving \$62.50 raise to start January 1, 2013. The resolution sets Elected Officials to receive \$1,000.00 increase for each year for 4 years to begin in January 2010. Then the Deputies are to receive 75% of the elected officials. The elected officials would receive \$83.33 a month increase. The Board felt that \$75.00 a month for regular employees would get things out of sync. Some comments were received regarding land valuation increase for the county and the savings with the employee insurance premiums. It was noted that the county is currently doing good, however that could change and with increases to wages the cost continue to increase each year whether the county is in good shape or bad shape. A motion was made by Brown to give a \$40.00 a month increase to regular employees to be effective January 1, 2013 and Corman seconded the motion. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Jim Marr, Sheriff met briefly with the Board to discuss the vehicles for the Sheriff's Department. The Board inquired if any of those vehicles were close to 100,000 miles. Marr noted the oldest vehicle is around 75,000 miles. It was determined the Sheriff's Department would not need a vehicle this year.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, July 9, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of July 2, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:01 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the July 2, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Also present is Jeff Wagner of Mainelli Wagner & Associates, P.C. Warren noted the electrical problem with dozer #815 has been fixed. The guys are working on inventory and should be done this week. They are working in the shop this week doing regular maintenance on vehicles and motorgraders, etc. Some of the motorgraders are out on the county roads this week helping to get other parts of the county roads maintained. Project C65-(601), located 1 mile south and 1 mile east of Nelson on Road 3700, is almost complete. Project C65-(672), located 1 mile south of Ruskin on Road K, is almost complete. The road crew will be moving to Project C65(333), located 1 mile south and 2 miles west of Bostwick on Road C from 2720-2750 next. They will be removing trees this week. Warren & Buescher are working on the budget this week. Warren also noted that on July 25, 2012 at 10:00 the Federal Highway will be present to do a Federal Audit on ARRA Project Oak South. Kirkham Michael Engineers will be present also.

Jeff Wagner discussed Project C65(656), Bridge #00230 located on the Nuckolls and Clay County line, on the North side of Section 6, T4N-R7W (Liberty Precinct). Wagner noted the test sample of the beam came back way high at 65 and they will need another sample of the beam again. Wagner noted they may be able to use the beams again for the new bridge and worst case will only need to purchase 3 new beams. Wagner updated the Board on Bridge Project C65 (631), Bridge #C006504330 located between Sections 15 & 16, T4N-R5W (Hammond Precinct). He noted the survey had been done. Project C65(302), Bridge #C0065421520 located between Sections 29 & 30, T3N-R7W (Nelson Precinct) is waiting on the Corp Permit. Bridge #C006504220 is on hold until the survey and hydraulics study is done. Discussion was held regarding the status of the 8th Street Project in Superior was at. Discussion was held regarding getting the estimates on these projects for budget purposes. Discussion held regarding the Federal Buy Back Project. It was noted the first funds would not be received until 2014.

Discussion was held regarding the continuous leaks in the courthouse roof. Some are from the gutters and down spouts, others are still leaking around the clocktower.

County Treasurer, Vicki Ensign met briefly with the Board to report on the Summary of Investments as of June 30, 2012. Ensign also informed the Board that due to the Legislature changes the Pledged Securities are now located in the Treasurer's office instead of the County Clerk's office.

Carrie Miller gave a report on the May 17, 2012 Safety Committee Meeting. A copy of the minutes was submitted. The Safety Committee recommended the water fountain in the main floor hallway be removed or replaced. The Board agreed and determined to have the water fountain removed. The Road Department is to remove it. Miller noted the committee also recommends safety training on fire extinguishers for all employees





and also trainings for different disasters. Brown noted the Emergency Manager should be the official for such trainings as noted in the LEOP book. Miller discussed the safety committee is recommending the use of the Nirma approved forms and are currently updating the Safety Committee Handbook to show these changes. The Safety Committee is also recommending anyone who drives a county owned vehicle should take a Drivers Training Program. Miller noted they are working hand in hand with Nirma and notes this will make Nuckolls County on good terms with them and will in turn make the county's premiums less. Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren noted some of the road employees are out maintaining the county roads this week. Warren informed the Board of a motorgrader that broke a crank shaft and will need to be overhauled. John Deere does not offer this size motor anymore. The Board gave their approval to authorize the County Road Mechanic to do the overhaul on the motorgrader. Warren informed the Board of an incident at the Road Shop in Nelson which resulted in the 10,000 lb Hoist being damaged. The incident has been submitted to the County Insurance Company. Warren noted that Project C-65(601) Southeast of Nelson is complete. The Road employees are working this week on mowing roadside ditches and spraying weeds around guardrails. Warren gave the Board an update on Project HRRR STWD (086) Intersection Signs. Warren noted that Loren Drohman has purchased gravel, however they would like to take out the small bridge and replace it with a tube before Drohman adds the gravel. This has been on the 1&6 Year Plan for a number of years. Project C-65 (526), located between Sections 25 & 26, T4N-R6W (Sherman Precinct). Gary Kubicek has requested to have the road department take out some of the sand on Road V. Warren noted that he has been talking with Nirma regarding the incident with the hoist in the Nelson Shop. Nirma will be paying approximately \$2,500.00 for replacement on the hoist. The County Road will pour the cement for the new hoist in exchange for the \$500.00 deductable. Warren has been checking on prices and specs for a new hoist. He has found one at Hamilton Services in Aurora, Nebraska for \$7,150.00. The hoist is a Symmetrical, Rotary. Discussion was held regarding the \$7,150.00 being added to the new budget. The claim check from Nirma will go back into the Road Department's Revenue. Warren noted the #2 Motorgrader had sheered off the flywheel bolts. They are in the process of replacing the flywheel and will also replace the water pump while they have the motorgrader torn apart. Warren will keep having the weeds sprayed around bridges and guardrails on the county roads. Warren updated the Board on several other small projects within the county.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, August 13, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of August 6, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:01 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the August 6, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren submitted a map of the courthouse grounds, showing the portions of the sidewalks that need to be replaced. Warren estimated approximately 98 yards of cement is needed. Warren informed the Board of a wood deck bridge being damaged by fire, which was reported by the Nuckolls County Sheriff's Office. The estimated damage to the wood planks will cost around \$500.00. Bridge #C006524020 located between Sections 2 & 11, T1N-R5W (Hardy Precinct) was reported by Mainelli Wagner of having a cap split which will need to be replaced. Project C-65(572), located between Section 7 & 18, T1N-R6W (Garfield Precinct) Twin Barns will be started today. Warren noted that he is having guys out mowing and spraying around bridges this week. An update was given on the Nuckolls/Clay County Bridge Project C-65(656), which should be ready to be bid in September. Warren also gave an update on Project C-65(302), which is being planned to be bid in October.

The Board gave an update on the Tire Recycling Project held August 11, 2012. The County received 113.9 ton of tires in 3 ½ hours. The County's limit was 59 ton.

Derek Clark, City of Superior met briefly with the Board regarding Project BR-1990(7), In Superior, 8th Street Bridge. Clark informed the Board that as the bridge is in the City limits, it does not qualify for 5% of the Federal allowances. Clark noted he is still anticipating the project will go forward with a construction date around June/July 2013. Clark submitted to the Board a Resolution and Agreement regarding the change in the costs.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve signing the Resolution #08-13-2012 which Authorizes Chairman Combs as LPA to sign the Project Agreement for Project BR-1990(7), In Superior. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the LPA Program Agreement-BR Funds for Project BR-1990(7), In Superior. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Vicki Ensign, Treasurer met with the Board to submit the County Treasurer's Distress Warrant Report for August 13, 2012. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve the Report as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Ensign submitted a Resolution for approval to change, add or release a Pledged Security for the County Treasurer's office for collateral on bank deposits. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve the Resolution dated August 13, 2012 for Pledged Security to release pledge security to Hamilton Mich Cmnt School District in the amount of 200,000.00 and add pledge security to Buffalo Cnty Neb



School Dist No 009 in the amount of \$225,000.00 to protect bank deposits in excess of FDIC at Commercial Bank. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager/Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board to submit an Interlocal Agreement for Cooperative Public Safety Services by an Among The Counties of Adams, Buffalo, Clay, Dawson, Franklin, Frontier, Gosper, Hall, Hamilton, Harlan, Kearney, Lincoln, Nuckolls, Phelps, and Webster and the Cities and Villages Within Said Counties. The agreement is effective August 1, 2012 to July 31, 2017. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to Authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Agreement. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Stutzman also submitted a copy of the NE EMPG Grand Award in the amount of \$25,333.00 for 2012. Stutzman as the Emergency Manager will be required to submit claims to the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency in either Monthly or Quarterly and will receive the grant funds quarterly to reimburse his claims. Stutzman reported that he and the Twin Valley Weed Management toured the Little Blue River looking for noxious weeds such as fragmities. He reported they did find a couple patches of fragmities, He also noted that honey locust trees and willows are a problem on the Little Blue River.

The Board met with Tim Schmidt, County Attorney regarding the longevity bonus policy for part time employees who were hired before 1997. Also present are Susan Rogers, Assessor; Vicki Ensign, Treasurer and Royce Gonzales, District Court Clerk. Some questions had been asked last week that were addressed. Clerk Kassebaum contacted Nebraska Department of Labor to get their determination and reported her findings to the Board. After some discussion it was determined that the part time employees who are receiving a pro-rated bonus will continue to receive the pro-rated bonus until they max out at \$150.00. A claim will be submitted by employee for back wages in the amount of \$1,470.00 to the County Clerk for payment. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to make the part-time employees who were hired prior to 1997 that are receiving the pro-rated longevity bonus will continue receiving the pro-rated longevity bonus until they reach \$150.00 and continue the \$150.00 a month bonus until they leave employment with the County. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A contract with Deb Klein was submitted for Janitorial/Custodial Services for Nuckolls County Courthouse for approval. The contract is effective July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013 in the amount of \$1,700.00 a month. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the said contract with Deb Klein for Janitorial/Custodial Services for Nuckolls County Courthouse effective July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013 in the amount of \$1,700.00. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Donald Williams and Carrie Miller both members of the Nuckolls County Safety Committee met with the Board to give a report on the Safety Committee's recommendations. They discussed having a Driver's Training Program implemented for the County as recommended by Nirma. This will require all county employees who drive county vehicles to attend and pass the Driver's Training Program. The Safety Committee would like to set this up for sometime this fall. The Board requested to have a certificate printed for each employee who completes the training. The Safety Committee handbook will be updated to accommodate this change. The County Board of Commissioners will be required to make the final approval of the handbook changes. The County Road Department will be conducting a "Chainsaw Safety Training" soon.

Williams and Miller also submitted the June 21, 2012 Safety Committee Minutes. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Combs to accept the June 21, 2012 Safety Committee Minutes as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.



An application for membership to the Heritage Highway, Byway 136 was submitted for approval. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the application form to the Heritage Highway, Byway 136 for 2012 membership. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Lyle Mertens of the Nuckolls County Fairboard met with the Commissioners to submit an application for a Special Designated Liquor License for September 15, 2012 from 5:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. for beer, wine and spirits for a wedding reception. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to approve the Special Designated Liquor License Application submitted by the Nuckolls County Ag Society for a wedding reception on September 15, 2012 to serve beer, wine and distilled spirits at the Nuckolls County Fair Ag Building". Combs, Corman and Brown all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

The Board met with the Budget Making Authority on the 2012/2013 County Budget. Vicki Ensign and Royce Gonzales were both present. Discussions were held regarding projects that need to be done within the fiscal year. The Extension roof to be re-shingled, gutters repaired and installed at the Courthouse, cement work on the Courthouse sidewalks, install a vertical lift on the main floor of the courthouse and ceiling tiles for the upstairs where water has damaged them. Ensign submitted a new Estimated County Budget for the Board showing current figures. Also submitted was a 2012 School Valuation Figures to show that the County is seeing a reduction in Specials Assessments for 2012 in the amount of 1,049,133. The Real Estate & Personal Property is showing an increase from 2011. The total increase in valuation from 2011 is 79,959,284.

It was determined to do a final review of the budget on August 27, 2012 and to hold the Budget Hearing on September 4, 2012 at 11:00 a.m.

It was determined to hold a bid letting for the Re-shingling on the Extension Building Roof for August 27, 2012 at 11:00 a.m. The Board would like to have the roof re-shingled by September 30, 2012. Also discussed is some items they would like to have on the spec sheet.

There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 12:23 p.m. until Monday, August 20, 2012.

The board reconvened at 9:01 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda with a change in the agenda item at 11:15 a.m. to meet with Budget Making Authority for Budget Decisions to 10:15 a.m., and to approve the August 20, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren reported that another incident occurred last Friday night of someone burning a county bridge at the same location as the week before. The bridge planks had been replaced last week from the prior incident. It was reported to the Nuckolls County Sheriff. A report of damage to a bridge located on Road 'A' & Road 4100 was discussed. Brown suggested it would be best to fix the bridge. Project #C-65(572) located between Section 7 & 18, T1N-R6W (Garfield Precinct) "Twin Barns" should finish this week. The tubes look as they are put in too low, however they were done to plan design. They will start work on Bridge #C006524020, located between Sections 2 & 11, T1N-R5W (Hardy Precinct). They will be fixing the cap on the bridge. The road will closed for 2 weeks during the repairs. Bolte will be working on lining up two intersections in Blaine Precinct on Road 'R' and Road 4100. Discussion was held regarding Project C-65 (302) regarding who is to do the removal of the old bridge when the project is ready to start. It was determined to let the contractor do the removal. However the County will be doing the road construction. Warren noted the transmission on the Blue Peterbuilt went bad and needs replaced. Warren found another used transmission for \$3,250.00. The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the August 27, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Also present is Mark Mainelli from Mainelli Wagner Associates. Warren informed the Board that he had been in contact with Don Kottmeyer and he has agreed to pay the county road department to do the repairs to his bridge. The County is providing the bridge planks. Projects C-65(664) & Project C-65(665), the Angus/Nora Intersections is complete. Bridge #C006524020, between Sections 2 & 11, T1N-R5W (Hardy Precinct) has been completed. Project C-65(630), located between Sections 29 & 30, T2N-R5W (Spring Creek Precinct), will be removing the bridge and installing a 42" tube this week. The Road Department will be working on Project C-65(601), located between Section 1, T2N-R6W (Nora Precinct) and Section 6, T2N-R7W (Highland Precinct) will be the next project to be started. They will be removing an old wooden bridge and replacing with a tube. The Sign crew is busy putting up new signs this week. The Lawrence crew will be mowing road ditches this week. One of the mowers is being repaired. One of the gravel trucks is out hauling gravel to needed areas. Next week Warren will have the blades out grading the gravel roads. The pup trailer had a complete new box put on due to an accident last spring. They will be able to pick it up this week. They have sold some extra snow plow tires they no longer need for \$600.00. Discussion held regarding the Swamp bridge negotiations for an Interlocal Agreement between the County and Rainwater Basin Joint Venture. Warren and the Board discussed the repairs to the sidewalks at the courthouse.

Mark discussed the Local Bridge Select Policy for the Federal Funding Buyout Program for the Nebraska Department of Roads. The criteria are set for establishing eligibility to receive the funds. OCTOBER 15, 2012 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, October 15, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of October 1, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the October 1, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Also present is Jim Bolte, Foreman.

Warren requested an Executive Session. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to enter into Executive Session at 9:03 a.m. for personnel reasons. Present for the Executive Session is Combs, Corman, Brown, Warren, Buescher, Bolte and Kassebaum. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to leave Executive Session and return to the regular session of the Board of Commissioners at 9:07 a.m. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Bolte & Kassebaum gave the Board a brief update of the requirements by Eletec, Inc. for the removal and installation of the new vertical lift for the courthouse. Also Bolte & Warren discussed with the Board the issue of the sidewalk between the courthouse and the sheriff's department. Water drainage from the courthouse parking lot is a factor in the design of the sidewalk being discussed.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve a request from Marvin Hoffman for an Easement for Water Line located between Sections 3 & 4, T3N-R6W, Blaine Precinct to run a water line under a county road and in the county road ditch. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve Resolution 2012-10-15 for a Relaxation of Minimum Design Standards for Bridge Project No. C006521525 for design speed from 50 mph to 40 mph on the sag vertical curve for the project. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Warren noted that some of the maintainers are out working on potholes on county roads. Warren was contacted by Thiesen Construction and they would like to start on the bridge south of Deweese this week. Warren will check to make sure all contracts have been signed before they start. The Department of Roads will be doing underwater bridge inspections on the bridges along the Little Blue River and the Republican River, which will be around 9 bridges all together. The Road Department has received 30-35 new Kenwood Radios which were ordered to abide by state requirements for the switch to narrow banding. The radios were purchased through Pierce Electric. They will be installed into the trucks and vehicles soon. The Concrete for the new hoist has been pored and waiting for it to cure. The Road Department received insurance funds for the replacement of the pup trailer which was involved in an accident earlier this year. They are hauling gravel to certain county roads upon requests. Warren estimated the cost of the repairs needed for the bridge in Oak, which was closed last month. The estimated figure is \$26,500.00.





A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to accept the August 2012 Sheriff's Board Report as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Tim Schmidt, County Attorney; Vicki Ensign, County Treasurer; Susan Rogers, County Assessor; Royce Gonzales, District Court Clerk and Diane Wehrman, County Clerk Magistrate all met with the Board to discuss concerns regarding the heating and air chiller system for the courthouse. The heating and air is currently being regulated by a system serviced by Rasmussen Mechanical. The systems in the courthouse are regulated by computer controls. The complaints are the rooms are not being regulated evenly. The Attorney, Treasurer and Assessor have all asked to have their individual units changed to a manual control so they can regulate their own offices. The Board gave their authorization for this and they would like to have Rasmussen Mechanical here on October 29, 2012 to do a presentation on how the system works.

Susan Rogers, County Assessor met briefly with the Board to submit a Maintenance Quote from Esri Inc. for the software program for the GIS. The cost is \$400.00 a year per computer. She currently has the software installed on 2 computers. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Maintenance Agreement with Esri Inc. in the amount of \$800.00. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Rogers also discussed with the Board the fund in which she should put the claims for expenses accrued from Stanard Appraisal Services for TERC. It was determined to take the funds from the General Fund, Professional Services.

Kyle Larsen, Salesman for NMC-Cat out of Doniphan met briefly with the Board to check with them regarding any comments or complaints. No real issues were addressed.

Royce Gonzales, Clerk of the District Court met briefly with the Board to submit the renewal of a Subgrant Agreement for Child Support Enforcement Services between the Clerk of the District Court and the Nebraska Department of Health & Human Services. The effective date is from October 1, 2012 until September 30, 2013. The amount paid to Nuckolls County is \$7,389.00. Also in the Subgrant Agreement is a reporting worksheet. A **motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the subgrant agreement between the Nebraska Department of Health & Human Services and the Nuckolls County Clerk of the District Court for Child Support Services and authorize Chairman Combs to sign, effective October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.**

Royce also gave an update on the Legislative Conference in which he and Chairman Combs both attended. The discussion involved the issues of Inheritance Tax and Conservation Easements.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the renewal of membership to NACo (National Association of Counties). Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Clerk Kassebaum reported that Nuckolls County received \$9,203.00 in Nirma Dividends this year. Kassebaum, Warren & Buescher all attended the Nirma workshop in Kearney on October 4th & 5th.

A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve a Resolution regarding Nuckolls County's participation in Title VI-Civil Rights, Americans with disabilities/Section 504 of Rehabilitation Act and to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Title VI Nondiscrimination Agreement between Nebraska State Department of Roads and Nuckolls County (Local Public Agency) documents. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, October 29, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of October 15, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:01 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the October 15, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Also present is Jeff Wagner of Mainelli Wagner & Associates P.C. Warren noted he had a safety meeting last week regarding the road employee's blading the gravel roads against traffic. Warren submitted a estimate from the Road Department to help the Village of Oak temporarily repair the bridge in Oak. The quote of \$3,013.00 was for man hours for the County Road Employees that would be used in doing those repairs. Warren noted they have been stock piling gravel at the road department and are pretty much done hauling to county roads at this time. Warren gave the Board an update on the Nuckolls/Clay County Project #C-65 (656) located on the Nuckolls & Clay County line in Liberty Precinct. Warren informed the Board that the City of Superior was willing to go half and half on the armour coating for 15th Street between the church and the bridge. The Board noted that this is not in the budget this year, however would consider it for next budget year. The estimate would be \$14,000.00 for the County's half. Warren noted they have started working on cutting trees. Warren also noted they have been working on switching out the new radios that are required for the narrowbanding. There is a little bit of mowing left to do. Clerk Kassebaum gave the Board and the Road Department an update on when the new interior vertical lift will be delivered to the County. The Road Department will be removing the old lift and putting up support beams for the new lift. The date the lift will be delivered to the County is approximately December 28, 2012.

Jeff Wagner with Mainelli Wagner & Associates P.C. informed the Board that Mainelli Wagner will be on the Call List for the Department of Roads List of RFP's for Construction and Engineering Companies. The 8th Street Bridge Project in Superior will be required to pick and Engineer from this list.

Wagner was also present to give his opinion on a request from Agrex Inc. to clean out and reshape the road ditch along Road B from Road 3650 to 3750 to help prevent flooding. Also present is Bruce Tinkham from Agrex, Inc. Wagner noted that he had been out to view the property in question. The question from the County is who owns this property and does it conflict with the Rail Road. Wagner noted there is a 48" Concrete Pipe which goes under the Highway which drains into smaller corrugated tubes which are under the Agrex driveway. It was also noted that all the pipes and tubes were clean from debrie. Wagner noted that Agrex, Inc. will need to have a full hydraulic study done to really find what would be required to do to correct the flooding issue. The Board put Warren in charge of finding out how much the RR Right of Way is. If any work is to be done on RR ROW they would require permission from the RR. It was noted that Agrex may need to do some landscaping to help with the flooding problem on Agrex's property or replace the smaller tubes for larger ones to help with the water drainage. No decision made at this time.

A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to accept the September 2012 Sheriff's Board Report as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.





Clerk Kassebaum requested to purchase a new computer and printer for the Voter Registration/Election computer as the computer and printer was originally provided by the State of Nebraska, Election Division in 2005. Kassebaum will submit estimates for the cost.

Chairman Combs recessed the meeting to go into Board of Equalization at 9:58 a.m. Chairman Combs reconvened at 10:04 a.m. for regular session.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager/Noxious Weed Superintendent met with the Board to decide what to do about the Lawrence Fire Department needing narrowbanding by December 31, 2012. Also present is Gerald Buschkoetter, Lawrence Fire Chief. Lawrence Fire Department was left out of the Nuckolls County Narrowbanding Grant and also the Webster, Clay & Adams County grants. Discussion about who is responsible for the costs. Buschkoetter noted they had Platte Valley Communications from Hastings down last Friday and they did the narrowbanding on the radios and about half of the pagers. However it was noted the repeater was not able to be programmed for the narrowbanding. The cost for a new repeater is about \$2,500.00. \$15.00 to \$20.00 per radio and pager is the cost for programming. It is estimated that it would cost around \$2,000.00 to \$4,000.00 to get Lawrence Fire Department up to Federal Standards for narrowbanding. Stutzman noted they may want to check on the siren also to make sure it is able to be programmed. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to fund up to \$3,000.00 by Nuckolls County with the possibility of additional costs in the future. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. It was noted the funds are to be paid from the Civil Defense Fund. Also noted the County may proceed with getting reimbursed from Webster, Clay & Adams (Lawrence Fire District located in those counties) for the prorated funds for the costs of the narrowbanding.

Vicki Ensign, County Treasurer met with the Board to have a contract with GIS Workshop for the maintenance of the software for the Treasurer's tab for the County website for Real Estate. The Website provides information regarding a property's taxes. The cost is \$2,500.00 a year. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve the contract between GIS Workshop and Nuckolls County Treasurer for software support for the County website for the Treasurer's tab in the amount of \$2,500.00. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Jeff Dillon and Chris Andersen from Rasmussen Mechanical of Kearney met with the Board to discuss how the heating and cooling system works in the Courthouse. Ensign, Rogers, Gonzales were present for most of the session with Rasmussen. It was noted that the Courthouse has a 4 pipe system, 2 pipes for heating and 2 pipes for cooling. The boilers heat the temperature of the water for heating and the air chiller cools the water for cooling which is based on outside conditions. The pipes are then directed to fan coil units throughout the building. The fan coil units have 2 positions of open and closed, they open if they need heat or cool or they close if no heat or cool is being called for. The chiller will not come on if the outside air is below 50 degrees. The new programmed system is designed to control the heat and cool for the most efficient way. The program



can be set to an occupied or non occupied time, like night time, holidays or weekends. The program also enables the control of setting a low and high setting in which the system will not go beyond those set points by more than .5 degrees when it is being controlled by the computer program. The fans will still run when the call for heat or cool is not open. The valve will shut off and then the fan will cycle off. It was noted that each office has at least 1 fan coil unit with a thermostat control and the sensors for the temperature are in the thermostat controllers. Dillon commented that the Courthouse needed a fresh air return to make the heating and cooling system run more efficiently. The Board recessed to go to the basement to look at a fresh air exchange with Rasmussen at 11:35 a.m. they returned to the regular meeting at 11:40 a.m. Dillon noted the exchange units are more for a residential property and not for a commercial building. It was noted that a fresh air return system would help out with bacteria and allergy issues. It would also help out with the air chiller, which would be more efficient as the air chiller would not run as often. Dillon also noted that a Optimal Start/Stop System would be beneficial in efficiency. He also noted issues with humidity in the building would cause the variations in heat or cool. Ensign was concerned that when the office is calling for heat the air comes on. Rogers noted that the Assessor's office is sweltering in the morning and then by 9:00 a.m. the air comes on when their thermostat is set at 72 degrees. Discussion was had regarding the computer terminal room is right below her room which may cause the issue of excessive heat in the morning as the rooms are locked up at night. It was noted the communication from the county to Rasmussen (port 2525) is still not working. Clerk Kassebaum will take care of that. 2 motions were made by Brown. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to turn the entire Courthouse to computer control for heating and cooling. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to have all requests for change to the settings, be brought to the Board for approval. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. Rasmussen's will check on the Assessor's office, the old extension office in the basement and the Courtroom sensors to make sure they are working properly. The County Assessor, County Treasurer and Clerk of the District Court all requested to have their fans turned to auto. The Board approved their request.

Dan Swartzkopf of Krull Insurance Agency met with the Board to give them an update on last fiscal year and the first quarter of this year for the County Employees Medical and Dental Plan. Also present for this session is Susan Rogers to represent the Insurance Committee and Royce Gonzales, District Court Clerk. It was noted that last fiscal year the County ended in very good shape. The Aggregate report noted a 56% loss ratio. 4 individuals were on the 50% of Specific Stop Loss Report however no one exceeded \$30,000.00. For the new contract period as of September 30, 2012, the County is at a 67.7% loss ratio. Brown requested if anyone was on the list for potential high claims for the future. Swartzkopf noted that no one was on the list although 1 person was on the list for over 50% of the Specific Stop Loss Coverage. It was noted that the County is responsible for the first \$35,000.00 for an individual before the Stop Loss Coverage kicks in. Swartzkopf also updated the Board of a future obligation due to the Health Reform Act of the County's responsibility of reporting a Summary Plan to each employee 45 days prior to renewal. Swartzkopf noted that Mid American Benefits will provide this requirement for the County. The obligation will be effective July 1, 2013 at Nuckolls County's renewal period. It was discussed that the Summary Plan could be added to the County website to help reach this obligation. Swartzkopf also noted that he attended a Department of Insurance meeting which he noted the State of Nebraska will offer insurance for the Small Group or Individual's requirement of having insurance. This will cost the state over 90 million dollars to implement and between \$30,000.00 to 40,000.00 to maintain due to requirements of the Health Reform Act. Discussion was held regarding how the Health Reform Act is driving the costs of medical care up. Swartzkopf noted he will revisit the Board around February or March.

Chairman Combs recessed at 12:29 p.m. to do the jail inspection and as there is no further business the meeting is recessed until Monday, November 5, 2012.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday November 5, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of October 29th, 2012. Combs, Corman, and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:01 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the October 29, 2012 minutes as submitted. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren reported his findings after researching the ownership of the road ditch along Road B from 3650 to 3750, he noted that the Rail Road is owner of the ditch and therefore Nuckolls County is not responsible for cleaning it out. Mowing is completed. Installation of the new radios for narrow banding is finishing up. Warren reported that they are busy with shop work and that they will change all fluids on Unit 2, to try to determine any mechanical issues it might have. They have 2 driveway projects to work on. NOVEMBER 19, 2012 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, November 19, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of November 5, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The County Elected Officials met in the Nuckolls County Courtroom for the opening session of the Nuckolls County Government Day with the Senior Class from Superior Public School and the Junior Class from Lawrence Nelson Public School. The board reconvened at 9:59 a.m. for regular session of the Board of Commissioners meeting. Chairman Combs approved the agenda and the November 5, 2012 minutes as submitted.

The following correspondence was submitted to the Commissioners; Thanksgiving card from Contryman Solutions Group, letter from NEMA regarding the Homeland Security Grant Monitoring Visit to Nuckolls County; Nebraska LTAP Newsletter.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department.

Buescher noted that the main printer for the road department was giving her trouble and has inquired on some prices for a replacement. The best quote that was submitted was from Quill in the amount of \$199.99 with a possible use of a \$50.00 coupon. Originally the cost is \$299.99. A motion was made by Combs and seconded by Corman to purchase the printer from Quill for \$199.99. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Warren updated the Board on the progress of Project C-65(659) located between Sections 8 & 17, T4N-R8W (Hammond Precinct), Swamp project. Currently they are installing 3-9' tubes to replace a bridge. As part of the agreement with Game & Parks, the County will be closing the ½ mile road north after the project is complete also Project C-65(556), Deweese Bridge located on the North side of Section 6, T4N-R7W (Liberty Precinct), which is a shared project with Clay County, has the concrete deck poured. Nuckolls County has done the majority of the dirt work for the project. The Nebraska Department of Roads has been in contact with Warren regarding Bridge #C0065042042P located west of Bostwick which is eligible for grant funds. The grant is based on several criteria in order to be eligible. The State will pay the first 40% and then the County is to pay the last 60% in which the State will then reimburse the County the 60% after completion. These funds replace the old Soft-Match funds which are no longer available. The selection for these eligible bridges is picked from a computer selection process. The project would then be required to be added to this years 1&6 Plan.

Warren also informed the Board of the miscellaneous projects in the County. There are 2 guys working on putting up new signs and documenting their location, 2 guys are putting up Hazard Markers (Flex markers) on bridges. The #11 Motor grader is having some engine problems. Warren believes the engine is dirty, they will be cleaning it up and then see if that corrects the problems. Warren has several guys out cutting trees in the road ditches. Warren has requested to purchase some new chainsaws. He submitted a couple of quotes for a Husqavarna chainsaw. Warren is no longer having gravel trucks out for now. Several requests for road maintenance was discussed.



An Electrical Easement request was submitted for Randy Pearson to run an electrical line under a county road and county road ditch, located between Sections 3 & 10, T3N-R5W (Elk Precinct). A motion was made to approve the electrical easement submitted by Randy Pearson. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Carissa Uhrmacher, Project Director for Juvenile Services County Aid met with the Board to give report on the 2013-2014 County Aid Juvenile Services Budget and also the results of the Grant funds used for the 2011-2012 fiscal year. The Grant is applied for through the Crime Commission by the South Central Partnership, Regional Consortium organized by Adams, Clay, Nuckolls, Webster, Fillmore, Phelps, Kearney, Franklin & Harlan County's. In order to continue this process, Uhrmacher is requesting that Nuckolls County sign a Memorandum of Understanding regarding Juvenile Services County Aid Funding. Uhrmacher noted this does not cost the County any money. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Memorandum of Understanding Regarding Juvenile Services County Aid Funding, effective July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

County Treasurer, Vicki Ensign met with the Board to submit the 2012 Distress Warrants for the 2011 delinquent personal property taxes. There currently are 10 entities that have not paid for a total amount of \$5,139.94. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to accept the 2012 Distress Warrants as submitted. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Ensign all discussed with the Board the date for the Nuckolls County Employee Christmas Party. Originally the date was set for December 20, 2012. However with the change in scheduling by the Lawrence Nelson Elementary Christmas Concert for the same night, Ensign discussed having the County's Christmas Party moved to December 19th. It was determined to change the date to December 19, 2012. Ensign also requested to close the Courthouse on Monday, December 24, 2012 as Christmas is on Tuesday, December 25, 2012 and the Courthouse is only open for half a day on Christmas Eve. A motion was made by Combs and seconded by Brown to close all day on December 24, 2012. Combs and Brown voted Aye. Corman voted Nay. Motion carried by a majority vote.

An application for Special Designate Liquor License was submitted by Meyer Vineyards, Inc., dba Superior Estates Winery for a Winter Bazaar held on December 1, 2012 in the Nelson City Auditorium in Nelson Nebraska. Discussion was held regarding if this should have been sent to the City of Nelson for approval. It was determined to go ahead and approve. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve the SDL for Meyer Vineyards, Inc., dba Superior Estates Winery for a Winter Bazaar on December 1, 2012 at the Nelson City Auditorium. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Clerk Kassebaum submitted the NACO Bylaw changes and the Procedure for voting at the NACO Convention held December 12th, 13th & 14th. Discussion was held regarding the reflectors on county bridges with no guard rails. Discussion on maintenance work for Bridge #C006504535, located between Sections 4 & 5, T2N-R5W (Hammond Precinct).

Discussion was held regarding the final bill for the recycled tires collected during the tire recycling collection this summer. Discussion was held regarding the temperature reports for the offices at the Courthouse. Several issues were brought up and discussed.

Tim Stutzman, Emergency Manager met with the Board to discuss the request from Lawrence Rural Fire District for assistance in paying for the narrowbanding which is Federally required by January 1, 2013. All the other Fire Districts in the county received grant funding to help with this expense except Lawrence. Road Employees are busy with sign work on County Roads & Bridges, Shop work and cleaning out the Agrex ditch at Superior. It was announced that Paul Thornton will be temporarily working in the Hardy District for maintaining county roads. Brown discussed this week's findings with the heat and air system. It was noted they are finding that several screens on the hot and cold water were plugged. They are currently being cleaned and checked by Rasmussen Mechanical of Kearney. Discussion was held regarding the installation of main line screens for the hot and cold water which will catch the majority of debris before it reaches the individual units in the offices. The Board has asked Clerk Kassebaum to look into this for prices and descriptions.

A Management Representation Letter regarding the 2011/2012 Nuckolls County Audit Report which was compiled by Contryman & Associates P.C. was received. The letter is to let Contryman & Associates P.C. know that the County Board is satisfied the Draft Audit Report as submitted. A motion was made by Corman and

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, December 17, 2012 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of December 10, 2012. Combs, Corman and Brown present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Combs announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:01 a.m. Chairman Combs approved the December 10, 2012 minutes as submitted. Commissioner Brown requested to amend the agenda to include under the 9:00 a.m. agenda item of surplus property to include the DTN dish and Antenna from the Extension building. Chairman Combs approve the Agenda with changes. Also present for the meeting is Chuck Mittan of the Superior Express. Thomas Mayfield of National Healthcare Capital, LLC was present for the Board Meeting.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give an update on the current activities of the County Road Department. Warren noted that the Motorgrader Operators have their graders out grading the county roads this week. They are also working on tree removal around the county and also several pieces of road equipment are currently in the Nelson Road shop for repairs. They have installed the sand spreader to the gravel truck in preparing for the winter storms. They are also continuing the work on upgrading and replacing county hazard signs. A new Hazard Sure Flex HRR Sign is being reviewed. Discussion was held regarding a request for a extension of a driveway tube for a local farmer.

A Proposal for Professional Engineering Services for On-Call Engineering Services for 2013-2014 for Nuckolls County was submitted by Kirkham Michael. The cost for 2013 is \$105.00 per hour for a 1-person survey crew, \$165.00 per hour for registered land surveyor, \$138.00 per hour for project manager, \$130.00 per hour for design engineering, \$145.00 per hour for structural engineering, \$70.00 per hour for technical personnel, \$95.00 per hour for drafting, \$55.00 per hour for clerical. A 2% increase for 2014. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to authorize Chairman Combs to sign the Professional Engineering Services Agreement between Nuckolls County and Kirkham Michael for 2013-2014 Miscellaneous Engineering Services per request. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A quote from Jean Stichka for vertical blinds for the County Commissioners Meeting room was submitted. Decision tabled until January 7, 2013 meeting. Also a request to purchase a printer for the County Clerk's office was tabled until January 7, 2013 meeting.

Brad Baker, Chief Deputy Sheriff met with the Board in regard to purchasing 3 desk computers for the Nuckolls County Sheriff's office. The cost is \$595.00 each from WalMart. He would also like to purchase a back up drive for \$100.00. A motion was made by Combs and seconded by Brown to purchase the 3 desk computers and





1 back up drive for the Sheriff's Department from the General Fund. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried. The old computers are to be destroyed after they have been deemed as surplus property.

A Special Designated Liquor License Application was submitted by Elk Creek Country Club, Nelson, Nebraska for a Christmas Party at the Nuckolls County Fair grounds on January 26, 2013 to serve beer, wine and distilled spirits from 6:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Corman to approve the January 26, 2013 Special Designated Liquor License for Elk Creek County Club, Nelson Nebraska at the Nuckolls County Fairgrounds. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

A Special Designated Liquor License Application was submitted by Meyer Vineyards, Inc. dba Superior Estates Winery, Superior, Nebraska for a Corporate Event with dance on January 12, 2013 to serve beer, wine and distilled spirits from 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. A motion was made by Corman and seconded by Brown to approve the January 12, 2013 Special Designated Liquor License for Meyer Vineyards, Inc., dba Superior Estates Winery, Superior, Nebraska. Combs, Corman and Brown all voted Aye, 0 voted Nay. Motion carried.

Chairman Combs recessed at 9:58 a.m. to go into Board of Equalization. Chairman Combs reconvened into Regular Session at 10:12 a.m.

Thomas Mayfield with National Health Care Capital, Timothy Schmidt, County Attorney, John Keeland, CEO Brodstone Memorial Hospital and Sandy Borden were present for the discussion of having the County act as a pass through for a Hospital Bond by Brodstone Memorial Hospital to refinance their existing loans to receive a lower interest rate. The Hospital has been working with Thomas Mayfield in getting the process started. Mayfield noted the Hospital would be required to have a local municipality be the host (pass through) in order to qualify for the Hospital Bond. Mayfield has met with the City of Superior who recommended they talk with the County also. Mayfield is not looking for any action at this time however they would like to know if the County would be interested so they know which direction to pursue. Additional information would need to be provided if the County would decide to go ahead. Chairman Combs took this under advisement and no decision was made at this time.

Notification was received from the Nebraska Public Service Commission that an overpayment in funds had been transferred from the 911 Wireless Fund to the 911 Emergency fund. A claim was submitted by the 911 Wireless Fund for an overpayment to the 911 Emergency Fund. A motion was made by Brown and seconded by Combs to approve the reimbursement of funds to the 911 Wireless Fund in the amount of \$2,476.04.
