The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Thursday, January 5, 2017 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of December 19, 2016. Christensen, Zikmund and Blackstone present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Chairman Zikmund announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. Zikmund made a motion to approve the Agenda and the December 19, 2016 minutes Seconded Christensen. Zikmund and Christensen voted Aye. 0 voted Nay. Motion Carried.

Blackstone took his oath of office.

The First order of business is to appoint a new chairman for 2017 under the Reorganizational Meeting. A motion was made by Christensen to appoint Timothy Zikmund as Chairman of the Board of Commissioners for 2017 and Blackstone seconded the motion. A motion was made by Christensen to approve Resolution 03-17R, Designating Banks and Authorizing County Treasurer to Invest County Funds. The Resolution lists the banks for the Pledged Securities and the amounts for the Treasurer and County Clerk. Zikmund seconded the motion. Christensen, Zikmund and Blackstone all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried

A motion was made by Zikmund to approve Resolution 04-17R to Appoint Dr. Blecha as County Physician for 2017 and Blackstone seconded the motion. Zikmund, Christensen and Blackstone all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Chairman Zikmund announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. Christensen made a motion to approve the Agenda and the April 3, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Zikmund. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen voted Aye. 0 voted Nay. Motion Carried.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent, and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary met with the Board to give the weekly update on the road department. Their discussion included; motor graders are working the roads, gravel trucks are running, Warren is working on scoring bridges with the State Bridge Department, signs are being worked on and dirt work on Project #557 on the state line south of Hardy. Assessor Susan Rogers and County Attorney Sara Bockstadter joined the meeting for a brief discussion over correspondence with Innovative Solar Systems, LLC. Bockstadter will draft a letter explaining there is no Zoning and Planning in Nuckolls County. Warren provided Blackstone with the competitive cost figures on filters used by the road department.

Diane Wehrman and Judge Burns visited with the board about an updated phone line in the county court room to enable individuals to voice conference during trials.

MAY 8, 2017 PROCEEDINGS OF THE NUCKOLLS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, May 8, 2017 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of April 17, 2017. Christensen, Zikmund and Blackstone present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Chairman Zikmund announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. A motion was made by Christensen approve the Agenda and the April 17, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary of the Highway Supt. and Jeff Wagner of Mainelli Wagner & Associates, met with the Board to give the weekly update on the road department. Their discussion included; hauling rock & gravel, servicing machines and still working on Project #557 on the state line. Wagner explained that the State's County Bridge Match Program has advanced to the next stages in selection and has also added an additional \$4 million to the funds. Wagner also explained that some counties would have better chances if they partner up with another county.

A motion was made by Christensen to approve a Request to Place Buried Communications on Public Right-of-Way Within Corporate Limits of Nuckolls County from Windstream. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

County Attorney Sara Bockstadter addressed a letter received from the Department of Agriculture concerning continuing education hours for the Noxious Weed Department. Bockstadter agreed that she would draft a letter in response. A letter concerning lack of zoning regulations was also discussed. Bockstadter suggested posting somewhere on the Nuckolls County Website the county policy.

David Pedersen visited with the board about his intentions of a 20 year lease to support a Solar Farm on his personal property. The board asked Assessor Susan Rogers to explain how this would affect the taxation after the solar farm was established.

A discussion was held between the board and Assessor Rogers regarding Nebraska LB461.

Blackstone made a motion amend agenda at this time to discuss research he had gathered possibly replacing the North outdoor elevator with a handicap ramp. Seconded by Zikmund. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Blackstone presented a quote for \$9,000.00 to replace the elevator with an aluminum ramp, along with past several years of maintenance and repair figures from the elevator. Christensen expressed concerns that aluminum would look distasteful against the historical courthouse. The project would not be able to proceed without removing the chiller unit to the heating and cooling system on the north side of the building so no motion was made at this time

Buescher and Wagner returned to the meeting at this time for Culvert Bid Letting for STWD-CBMP (1) Project #708. Four bids were submitted; Contech Engineering Solutions \$37,010.00, Midwest Service & Sales \$39,298.06, Ace Eaton Metal \$41,260.00 and Metal Culverts. A motion was made by Blackstone accept the





bid of \$37,010.00 from Contech Engineering Solutions from Lincoln NE. Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Dustin Gay of Energizer Electric join the discussion about replacing the courthouse lights with LED lighting. On average the courthouse is having a fluorescent ballast repaired one to two times a month according to billing records. Blackstone figured the number of ballasts in the courthouse, the wattage they were using in electricity and the rebates available for changing to LED. With adding a couple light fixtures in darker areas, Blackstone estimated that replacing all the fixtures would pay for itself in approximately 4 years. Gay also brought some updated figures concerning the heating and cooling system. With the new Trane system purposed by Gay it's estimated to save 50-52% on utility, repairs and maintenance expenses. Zikmund expressed concerns that he feels it was spending too much money too fast. Treasurer Ensign said that the Inheritance Tax Fund has a current balance of \$1.7 million dollars and the previous boards liked to keep it closer to \$1 million. Ensign explained that if the board chose to continue with any of the projects in current discussion, that using the Inheritance Tax fund would have little to no impact on the tax payers other than cutting some county's expenditures in the future after they were completed. Zikmund stated that just because the county has it he doesn't feel that the board should spend it. Zikmund felt that the projects were moving too fast and an engineer and bidding process should be in place. Blackstone agreed that the projects should be bid, but hiring an additional engineer would be a waste of time and money. Christensen expressed concern of the bidders not being able to submit a fair bid due to lack of consistency without having an engineer provide specifications. Blackstone suggested advertising the projects for bid and letting the contractors bid their professional opinion of materials, equipment and time needed. No action was taken.

A motion was made by Zikmund to approve Special Designated Liquor Licenses for Meyer Vineyards, Inc., dba Superior Winery Estates for June 3, 2017 and Nuckolls County Agricultural Society for July 7th & 8th, 2017. Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Blackstone to accept the Monthly Board reports of the County Clerk, County Court, Sheriff, Treasurer and Clerk of the District Court as submitted. Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Samantha Haba approached the board on behalf of the Safety Committee about previously discussed panic buttons for the Courthouse offices. Sheriff Baker had received quotes previously and there has been no action to date. After discussion, a motion was made by Blackstone to have Baker get updated quote and if the expenditure was less than \$3,000.00 to proceed with installation. Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Blackstone explained that he had been reviewing contracts between Nuckolls County and Glenwood concerning the phone systems Nuckolls County has been leasing. The previous board had signed a contract with Glenwood in 2009 for installation and use of the current system. The contract was expired in 2014. Blackstone stated he felt the system rental appeared to be aged and felt the county could benefit from purchasing and owning the equipment. No action was taken.

Clerk Miller updated the board on the status of the water damage to the clock tower and County attorney's office from the April 30, 2017 rain and wind storm. The board requested that the phone system and the clock tower repairs be put on the next agenda.





There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 2:05~p.m. until Monday, May 22, 2017.

Jo Springer with SASA requested 2017 Annual funding allocation. Zikmund explained that the board had decided to see how the county's budget faired before granting yearly funding requests and they would let her know in the near future.





Paul Moyer with the Department of Agriculture presented Nuckolls County's Yearly Inspections Survey Report. Moyer explained Nuckolls County is one of 33 counties in the district that he serves. Nuckolls scored well, infestation was not a big issue but could use little work on the documenting and reporting aspects of the report.

The board held a discussion about returning to 4 meetings a month. Blackstone expressed he felt the board had a lot on their plates at the current time and having 2 weeks between meetings a month, it was really easy to forget their objectives. A motion was made by Blackstone that starting in June, the board agreed to return to 4 meetings a month. Seconded by Zikmund. Blackstone and Zikmund voted Aye. Christensen voted Nay. Motion carried. Clerk Miller will present a new Board of Commissioners schedule for approval the first meeting in June.

For the Buildings and Grounds discussion concerned the courthouse telephone, rain damage of the clock tower and advertising bids for current projects. Blackstone stated that he was communicating with Glenwood about replacing the service board downstairs to the phone system. Glenwood would be sending him an estimate and possibly giving the county the current phones in use. Clerk Miller explained still waiting on estimates for repair of the clock tower. The board all agreed that they should start with the 800 amp electrical panel for projects and would be advertising for bids in the local paper.

There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 2:20 p.m. until Monday, June 5, 2017.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, June 5, 2017 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of May 22, 2017. Christensen, Zikmund and Blackstone present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Chairman Zikmund announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. A motion was made by Blackstone approve the Agenda and the May 8, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Gary Warren, Highway Superintendent, and Cindy Buescher, Executive Secretary, met with the Board to give the weekly update on the road department. Their discussion included; small jobs around the county, motor graders are running, 911 sign work now just on rainy days, started engineering Edgar Spur Project, gravel trucks are running but gravel is short in all 3 pits, good feedback from the State line Project #577 by Hardy, and good participation last week in the CPR/AED refresher course with NIRMA.

A motion was made by Christensen to accept Monthly Board Reports from County Treasurer, County Clerk, County Court, Sheriff and Clerk of the District Court as submitted. Seconded by Blackstone. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen all voted aye. 0 Voted nay. Motion carried.

A discussion was held about the upcoming December NACO Conference. The Board was informed reservations would start June 22, 2017. The board all agreed that they enjoyed staying at the LaQuinta for the recent Board of Commissioners Conference.

Jacob Hurla with 360 Energy Engineers introduced himself to the board. After discussion concerning the current upgrades needed to county structures it was agreed that Hurla would return the next meeting with an engineering team to draft a report of 360 Energy Engineers services.

Stefanie Creech-Will with ASAP presented an allocation request of \$5,000.00 for the 2017/2018 budget year. The Board explained that they would be reviewing these requests closer to Nuckolls County's own budget time. No action was taken.

Ron Fryda presented 2017 contract between Nuckolls County and USDA Wildlife Services requesting \$8,525.50. Zikmund explained that the board wished to review all allocation requests after doing the county budget. Fryda explained that in 2016 Nuckolls County paid \$8,275.05 and received \$67,000.00 worth of services, the additional supporting funds came from Federal monies. Christensen felt that for \$67,000.00 Nuckolls County could hire a full time individual for these services. Fryda agreed, but stated it would then be the county's responsibility to produce the funds for that individual's salary, and though the contract did go up \$250.00 he felt it was a pretty good deal. Fryda expressed concern about over run of animal issues if the contract were to lapse and explained that the current contract expired at the end of the month. A motion was made by Blackstone to approve the 2017 contract between Nuckolls County and USDA Wildlife Services for \$8,525.50. Seconded by Zikmund. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen all voted aye. 0 Voted nay. Motion carried.

Jalonda Bouray presented Midland Area on Aging 2017 budget allocation request of \$9,029.00. Bouray explained that this is same amount as requested in previous years. The board all agreed that Midland Area on





Aging provides a great service to our county. A motion was made by Christensen to approve 2017 allocation request of \$9,029.00 To Midland Area on Aging. Seconded by Blackstone. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen all voted aye. 0 Voted nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Zikmund to enter Executive Session at 1:00 p.m. with the board, Donald Williams and Clerk Miller, for Personnel Security Reasons. Seconded by Blackstone. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen voted Aye. 0 voted Nay. Motion Carried. A motion was made by Zikmund to re-enter regular session at 1:06 p.m. Seconded by Blackstone. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen voted Aye. 0 voted Nay. Motion Carried.

Insurance Committee members Jim Bolte, Susan Rogers and Royce Gonzales joined the meeting, as well as Dan Schwartzkopf of Krull Agency, Gary Warren, Cindy Buescher and Treasurer Ensign. The Insurance Committee was able to present 3 options for Nuckolls County Health Insurance Plans. First plan was through Greenwich. This option left all current coverage as it is but total cost of the plan was \$1,275,037.00 which is a 74.8% increase over last years \$729,245.00 total cost. The second plan was United Health Care-AME3 (HRA) with total cost of \$737,849.00 a 1.2% increase with slight plan changes. The third option was with United Health Care (HSA) with a total cost of \$645,155.00 a 6.6% decrease in cost but raising the deductible from \$500.00 for individual and \$1,000.00 per family, to \$2,700.00 for individual and \$5,400.00 per family. This also increase out of pocket maximum charges from \$2,000.00 for individual and \$4,000.00 per family to \$4,400.00 per individual and \$6,850.00 per family. The insurance committee recommended the third option of United Health Care (HSA). With this option it would relieve the county the liability of claims and save significantly in overall costs. This also allows the county to retain the Liability Claims Reserve fund it has built through being self-funded, in the event self-funding be the best option in the future. Even with the small decrease in premium cost to the employees it would still prove to be a significant increase in out of pocket expenses. To help the employees adjust to the changes the recommendation of the county starting a Health Savings account with \$1,000.00 from the Liability Claim Reserve Fund for each insured individual and an additional \$1,000.00 over the course of the next year in monthly increments. With the savings of the new plan the county could also increase the employees (excluding the elected officials) wages to help with the higher deductibles. The Insurance committee suggested a 9% salary increase, 3% calculated in the funding of the Health Savings Accounts and 6% in actual wages. This allowing the employee to choose to contribute more into the Health Savings Account or receive as wages. Gonzales explained that this puts more responsibility back on the employee to maintain the overall general health and to choose what is best to invest for each individual or family. The wellness program would remain the same and no penalty for nonparticipation as was discussed last year. Zikmund expressed concern about a 9% increase stating no one can predict the future of insurance and this will most likely prevent any raises for years to come. The Insurance Committee felt this was the best way to help employees invest for possible insurance increases in the future. They explained it would be better to start preparing now when this option only affects the overall budget 1% at no additional costs to the taxpayers. Zikmund asked if the board could see the figures with cutting family insurance. Gonzales explained that it could be done but they would have to factor all the information with the different census count, not to mention that cutting family insurance actually makes Nuckolls County a smaller less desirable group to cover. A motion was made by Blackstone to adopt option 3 United Health Care (HSA) as the 2017/2018 health insurance option for Nuckolls County. Seconded by Christensen. Christensen and Blackstone voted ave. Zikmund voted nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Blackstone for Nuckolls County to join Partners Health Alliance Program. Seconded by Christensen. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen voted Aye. 0 voted Nay. Motion Carried.





After discussion the board made the decision to rewrite the Noxious Weed Supt position's job description changing from part time to fulltime, adding additional duties of working part time for the road department. Miller will advertise the job again after making the changes.

The salary discussion was eliminated due to the salary changes that were included in the previous motion adopting the Nuckolls County 2017/2018 Health Plan.

The revised Board of Commissioner Schedule to change back to 4 Mondays a month was reviewed.

There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 3:35 p.m. until Monday, June 12, 2017.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, June 12, 2017 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of June 5, 2017. Christensen, Zikmund and Blackstone present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Chairman Zikmund announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. A motion was made by Blackstone approve the Agenda and the June 5, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Zikmund. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

During the Buildings and Grounds discussion Christensen requested that the board develop a maintenance list of all known projects before budget of 2017. The board members all agreed that future projects should start with the electrical panel in the courthouse basement, and then the heating and cooling in the courthouse should be addressed. No action was taken.

At Department Head time Treasurer Ensign explained that the Board of Commissioner's budget would be exceeded due to insurance premiums. A motion was made by Blackstone for a transfer of \$6,500.00 from General Funds to the Board of Commissioners. Seconded by Zikmund. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen all voted aye. 0 Voted nay. Motion carried.

Warren, Buescher, Bolte, and other Officials joined the discussion about Vacation Time Cap Limit. Earlier this year when the new Nuckolls County Employee handbook was adopted it changed the cap limit from 240 hours to 120 hours. The justification for this was if multiple employees were capped out and resigned it could potentially cripple a department's budget. Though it affected very few employees, there were objections for the reasoning that if an employee was at the 120 hour cap limit they would not earn any additional vacation time until time was used bringing them back into compliance. In an addition to this decision, the board agreed all employees had until January 1, 2018 to get within the new guidelines. In readdressing this issue there were some supervisors for raising the limit to 180 hours, some that were indifferent and had hired additional staffing to allow their employees to use vacation, and there were others that wanted to keep it as is. A motion was made by Christensen to leave as stated in the current hand book. Motion died. Bolte asked to consider employees that had been with the county 15 years or more be raised to 180 as appreciation for long term service. Zikmund replied the employees got a substantial raise without eliminating any health care plans how much more appreciation did the employees need. A motion was made by Christensen to leave the plan as stated in the current employee handbook. Seconded by Blackstone. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen all voted aye. 0 Voted nay. Motion carried.

The board reviewed Eric Kennedy was unable to attend the phone system discussion. The board asked Miller to put it on the next agenda.

Ron Paul with Rasmussen Mechanical presented the board with various options they could choose from when deciding how proceed on with the heating and cooling system of the courthouse. Tommy Roemmich, the Clay County Highway Supervisor requested permission from the board to ask Nuckolls County's Highway Secretary, Buescher's assistance introducing the commonly used programs for the road department programs to Clay County's newly hired secretary. The board agreed.

A motion was made by Zikmund to enter into Executive Session for Personnel Reasons at 12:47 p.m. attending only the board. Motion died for lack of a second.

Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

RuAnn Root presented the board with CASA 2017 budget funding request. A motion was made by Zikmund to table until further budget review. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

The bid letting is set later in the meeting but she wanted to let the board know her intentions. Rogers stated eliminating the contract for this service would save considerably in the budget but would mean scheduling her part time individual more hours and the expense of mileage.

County Attorney Bockstadter discussed Noxious Weed letters the board had requested her to draft.

A bid letting was held at 10:30 a.m. to receive bids for the Maintenance Agreement for Assessor's office for the fiscal year 2017/2018. One bid was received by Stanard Appraisal Services Inc., Central City, NE. Stanard Appraisals bid is for 30 days for a total of \$22,800.00, any additional days will be billed at \$95.00 per hour. A motion was made by Christensen to accept the bid by Stanard Appraisal Services Inc. for the amount of \$22,800.00. Blackstone seconded the motion. Zikmund voted aye, Christensen voted aye, Blackstone voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

A bid letting was held at 10:30 a.m. to receive bids for the Re-Appraisal for Residential properties in Ruskin, Nora, Oak and Hardy for Assessor's office for fiscal year 2017/2018. One bid was received by Stanard Appraisal Services, Inc., Central City, NE. Stanard Appraisals bid is for 369 parcels at \$132.00 each for a total





of \$52,272.00. A motion was made by Zikmund to accept but table the bid from Stanard Appraisal Services, Inc. for the re-appraisal of the Residential properties in Ruskin, Nora, Oak and Hardy for the amount of \$52,272.00 from September 1, 2017 to August 31, 2018 and Blackstone seconded the motion. Zikmund voted aye, Christensen voted aye, Blackstone voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Kirk Hopkins with Business Telecommunication Systems gave a demonstration of Samsung IP Phones.

The board discussed status of advertising Courthouse projects for bidding process.

The board reviewed the two applications received for the Noxious Weed position. Miller will schedule interviews for next meeting.

Insurance Committee joined the meeting to explain it has been discovered that the individuals that are currently participating in the Flex Spending Plan or on Medicare are unable to open a Health Savings Account at the same time. The Insurance Committee asked that the 13 employees that this affects still get the \$1,000.00 to open their Health Savings Accounts, but that the county holds it until January 2018 when the Flex Spending Account obligations are fulfilled. A motion was made by Christensen to follow the recommendations of the Insurance Committee allowing 13 employees their \$1,000.00 but holding it till January 2018. Seconded by Blackstone. Christensen and Blackstone voted aye. Zikmund voted nay. Motion carried. Christensen stated that before the board adopts a new health plan in 2018 he would like a commissioner to sit in on the Insurance committee and a third party review the committee's recommendations. Clerk Miller explained that the board was invited to sit on all the committees. Zikmund was to sit on the Handbook committee and Blackstone and Christensen both have served on the Safety Committee. Krull Agency as our broker is basically a third party helping the committee review and shape the plan to Nuckolls County's needs. Rogers and Gonzales agreed that a board member should join them next year.

Per the 2014 Resolution setting the elected officials salary for the term 2015-2018 by state statute, the elected officials deputies were set to receive 75% of the officials salary, thus not allowing them to receive the cost of living raises the employees receive and closing the salary gap between the employees and the deputies. A motion was made by Blackstone to Approve the Resolution to Separate the Deputies Salary from the Elected Officials. Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone and Christensen voted aye. Zikmund voted nay. Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting was recessed at 2:45 p.m. until Monday, June 26, 2017.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, June 26, 2017 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of June 19, 2017. Christensen, Zikmund and Blackstone present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Chairman Zikmund announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. A motion was made by Christensen approve the Agenda and the June 19, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

The board started to draft a list of maintenance issues with the county properties.

A motion was made by Blackstone to accept the Safety Committee Report as submitted. Seconded by Zikmund. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Treasurer Ensign presented a Resolution of Pledged Securities. A motion was made by Christensen to sign the Resolution of Pledged Securities. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted ave, 0 voted nav. Motion carried.

Chairman Zikmund recessed the regular Board Meeting at 10:00 a.m. to enter Board of Equalization meeting.

Chairman Zikmund reconvened the Board of Commissioners meeting at 10:55 a.m.

County Attorney Sara Bockstadter presented a Letter of Understanding from Lancaster Youth Services Center. Bockstadter stated that with the recent changes in guidelines of how juvenile cases can be handled, it would be in the best interest of the county and the local department, for the board to acknowledge the understanding. A motion was made by Zikmund for the board to sign the Letter of Understanding with Lancaster Youth Services Center. Seconded by Christensen. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried. Bockstader also discussed with the board her concerns about the board's discussion of possibly not funding CASA on the annual budget allocation request. Bockstadter submitted a letter to the board addressing this issue and how the county court makes use of their services.

A discussion was held about the two Burial Assistance Applications. Blackstone asked Bockstadter what the county's obligations were in the Burial Assistance situations. Zikmund agreed the applications seemed to be submitted more frequently. Bockstadter stated that it was not uncommon for counties to have a contract with a funeral home that states the basic needs and expenses. The board asked Miller to put the applications on the July 3, 2017 agenda and contact Price Funeral Homes.

The board discussed the annual budget allocation requests. The total amount allocated out of Inheritance Taxes the each year is approximately \$47,000.00. Zikmund felt this was monies that could be used in other places of the county budget. Christensen questioned if possibly some of the services were being duplicated by different organizations. Blackstone questioned if it was fair that so much money is serving so few residents of the county. Blackstone stated that these are organization created by the state to supplement state agencies that are under manned and deficient in their services, now the state is expecting the counties to pick up the tab. No action was taken.





Assessor Susan Rogers presented the board with the Three Year Plan. Rogers also had a Tax List Correction on parcel 0001818.00 for \$567.21. A motion was made by Zikmund to have the Chairman of BOE Christensen sign the Tax List Correction. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Former Commissioner Danny Corman joined the meeting to express his concerns about the future spending of tax payer funds and give the board a list of the accomplishments of the Nuckolls County Commissioners over the last 15 years. Corman led off with his concerns about the recent adoption of the Nuckolls County Healthcare Plan and wage increase. Corman stated that land valuations are dropping and previous boards were always more conservative about wage increases. The insurance committee explained that the rumored 9% wage increase was not all salary. The committee showed Corman the options that were given to the county to choose from and the actual 6.6% decrease in funding costs changing from self-insured to fully funded plan. Gonzales explained to keep the same plan would have cost \$1.2 million and with the changes the county was able to save approximately \$600,000.00. Almost all of the expenses of the salary increase and starting of the employee's Health Savings Accounts were factored with the saving amount in mind, and there was only a 1% effect on the upcoming budget. Corman stated that he was always in favor of cutting family and/or employee-spouse plans to keep benefits affordable. Corman also expressed his disapproval of the Sheriff's Department having a fourth deputy. Corman felt the extra deputy was contingent on the city and village contracts. Corman also addressed projected projects for repairing the courthouse stating; though you really should keep the Inheritance Tax fund lower than a Million, if it's not broke don't fix it and the board should use the Inheritance Tax fund to buy down the property taxes for the land owners. If you are going to make improvement you should reopen the West entrance of the courthouse.

The board reviewed the Probation District #1 Budget Allocation Letter.

The board interviewed 2 applicants for the Noxious Weed position. No action was taken but asked Miller to put on the July 3, 2017 agenda.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 4:50 p.m. until Monday, July 3, 2017.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. A motion was made by Christensen approve the Agenda and the July 10, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

Judge Burns discussed with the board his thoughts about CASA. Burns explained the different agencies that are involved when the county court has a juvenile case, and felt that CASA was a very good asset. They have an independent assessment of the case, not influenced by the branches of State Health and Human Services Department, they have very accurate and organized reports, and their volunteers are well trained. The board explained they are looking at all agencies that submit annual allocation requests, to have a better understanding of how they actually service the tax payers of Nuckolls County. Buescher and Wagner also confirmed scheduling a bid letting August 7, 2015 for projects #705 & #706. Jay Lyon explained his concerns with the gravel management on the road to his residence.

Budget Committee Vicki Ensign and Susan Rogers joined a discussion concerning the various 2017Annual Allocation Requests that the board has tabled. Ensign explained that she had been communicating with the State Auditor's office about counties allocating to agencies. Counties are not obligated unless there is an interlocal agreement or regulation by state statute. Miller believed that all the requesting agencies were on a yearly basis. Zikmund suggested cutting back the amounts that the county gives but not completely denying the requests.

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, August 14, 2017 in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of August 7, 2017. Christensen, Zikmund and Blackstone present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Chairman Zikmund announced the 'Open Meetings Act Law' as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. A motion was made by Christensen approve the Agenda and the August 7, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Blackstone. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

The board signed a letter of support to the Riparian Improvement projects to the Little Blue River for 2018-2019 with supplying assistance from the Nuckolls County Weed Superintendent as time permits.

Assessor Susan Rogers presented to the board, she had received a bid from MIPS for \$4,648.70 to replace and install computers in the Assessor's Office. Rogers explained that after the power outage the courthouse experienced on August 4, 2017, that the middle office computer never recovered. The board agreed that the office should proceed.

Nick Elledge presented bids he had received for the purchasing the Noxious Weed/Emergency Management vehicle from Alexander Motors Inc. Elledge had 2 bids, 2018 Chevrolet Silverado Crew Cab 4X4 for \$27,825.00 and 2018 Chevrolet Silverado Double Cab 4X4 for \$26,219.00. A discussion was held about holding off the purchase and shopping around, but even the options on the lots were not in acceptable comparison with the state bid price.

Sheriff Baker and Budget Committee Vicki Ensign and Susan Rogers were present for the discussion of the Sheriff Department's Budgets. The board asked if Baker felt there was any where his budgets could be cut more. Baker said no, and explained that the only changes were in the salary and insurance lines of his budget. There was also a cell phone bill that was in the Emergency Management budget back to the Sheriff budget. The remaining line items had not changed in the last several years. Blackstone asked Baker if he felt that the department could cut vehicle line item and use cars instead of trucks, that surrounding counties use cars. Baker stated no, that surrounding counties also have difficulties with up keep of their cars. The board questioned why Baker's deputies needed such flashy vehicles. Baker explained that when the department replaces a vehicle, he gets numerous bids inside and out of the county, as well as researches state bids. It has been the experience of the department a current year new vehicle that's already built has been cheaper than ordering a new one. All of the flash, so to speak, is not ordered special. The trucks handle the use, are maintained under warranty and retain trade in value. There was a heated discussion that expressed personal opinions between Blackstone and Baker. The budget committee explained that due to staff changes, the insurance line item had actually reduced approximately \$5,000.00. The budget remained.

Gary Warren and Cindy Buescher presented County Road & Highway Bridge Buyback Budgets. Warren explained that with the Budget Committee they had removed an additional \$20,000 from the previously presented budget. A discussion was held about motorgrader and fuel line items. Warren explained that the last motorgrader purchase they did get a good deal. However, the motorgrader he is trading in the next round will not be as valuable on trade in towards the purchase. Blackstone questioned why if the previous year fuel cost is \$116,450.99 why there was \$300,000.00 budgeted. Warren explained that fuel use and prices are unpredictable and would like to leave it at \$300,000.00, the past few winters have been mild and those years fuel usage does





not reflect what a hard winter could cost. There was a heated discussion that expressed personal opinion between Warren and Blackstone. Ensign presented several past years fuel usage figures with the spread ranging from \$198,000.00 to \$268,000.00. Warren also asked the board to remember and consider that the road budget actually requires 15 months of functioning costs, due to the way taxes are collected, and those additional months are the department's busiest time of the year for projects. The budget remained

A motion was made by Christensen for the Chairman to sign the 2017/2018 Maintenance Contract between Nuckolls County and Stanard Appraisal for \$22,800.00. Seconded by Blackstone. Zikmund, Blackstone and Christensen all voted aye. 0 voted nay. Motion passed.

The board reconvened at 8:30 a.m. A motion was made by Christensen Amend the Agenda moving Buildings and Grounds discussion to 10:00 a.m. due to the cancellation, and to accommodate adding NIRMA Director and Fillmore County Commissioner Larry Cerny to the agenda. Christensen's motion also included approving the November 20, 2017 minutes. Seconded by Zikmund. Blackstone, Zikmund and Christensen all voted aye, 0 voted nay. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Zikmund for the Chairman to sign the Resolution extending Nuckolls County's commitment to participate in NIRMA and NIRMA II for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2022. The officials all agreed after reviewing the NACO Elected Officials Salary Survey, they would like to see salaries set as; 2019 -\$45,858.00 and Sheriff \$52,737.00, 2020- \$49,108.00 and Sheriff \$56,474.00, 2021-\$51,858.00 and Sheriff \$59,637.00 and 2022- \$54,108.00 and Sheriff \$62,224.00. The officials explained that these amounts are still less than what the state survey suggests, but it does help close that gap between what the officials are currently making and what several counties of similar dynamic are making. Nuckolls County is 82nd out of the 93 counties in the state of Nebraska. Gonzales also explained in the discussion that with the recent change in benefits offered, that the regular employees were offered an increase in salary. The elected official's salaries are held to a resolution by State statute, meaning the officials will go a year and half without any compensation for the loss of benefits. Christensen express his concern about trying to make up for the past lack of compensation within one 4 year resolution. Blackstone stated that he felt that the Nebraska Association of County Officials Survey was merely a suggestion and would like to know what other employment options payed in Nuckolls County. The Officials stated this comparison would not be apples to apples as there is an increased amount of risk of length of employment and personal liability, as well as no educational program that you can take to prepare you for county government operations. No action was taken and other entities of Nuckolls County will be surveyed.

Chairman Zikmund recessed the regular Board Meeting at 10:30 a.m. to enter Board of Equalization meeting.
